SUPERIOR CLASS OF SHIPWRIGHT-APPRENTICES.

Navy-Office, July 8, 1811.

BY His Majesty's Order in Council, dated 20th September 1809, a Plan of Education was established at the Royal Naval College at His Majesty's Dock-Yard at Portsmouth for a Superior Class of Apprentices to Shipwrights, and Twelve Persons were admitted as Students on the 1st Day of January last;

And it being determined that Five more Students shall be admitted, the Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy hereby give Notice, that the Examination of Candidates will take place in His Majesty's Dock Yard at Portsmouth, on the 6th November next, at Eight o'Clock in the Morning; and that such Persons as may be desirous of becoming Candidates for Admission, are required to send Notice of their Intention to the Navy Board, or the Commissioner of the aforesaid Yard, on or before the 1st Day of that Month.

The Candidates must be at least Fifteen, and not more than Seventeen Years of Age.
