His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

IT is ordered, by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, that the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the Twenty-second of this instant August, be further prorogued to Friday the Fourth Day of October next.

THE following Address has been presented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent; which Address His Royal Highness was pleased to receive very graciously:

To His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT of the United Kingdom, &c. &c.

WE, the High Sheriff and Grand Jury of the County of Limerick, at Summer Assizes assembled, most humbly beg Leave to express to Your Royal Highness the cordial Satisfaction we feel on the Re-appointment of Your Royal Brother to the Command of His Majesty's Armies.

These Armies have successfully contended against a proud and inveterate foe under Circumstances of peculiar Difficulty, and with inferior Numbers; and at no Period in the History of this Empire was its Military Character more highly raised or more invariably supported.

We well know what Portion of this Success is attributable to the Zeal and Courage of those who compose His Majesty's Army, but we as fully feel how deeply we are indebted to him under whose System and Controul that Army has been so organized and disciplined, as to baffle every Stratagem, and repel the Enterprize of an Enemy who numbers the Victories he has obtained by the Battles he has fought against the Armies of the Continent, but who has only met Defeat when opposed to ours.

To the Foundation thus laid by His Royal Highness Field Marshal the Duke of York, aided by the Conduct and Valour of the Forces under his Command, we owe that Security which we possess, and those Triumphs which we enjoy; and

from the Wisdom evinced by Your Royal Highness in again placing under his Care that Army which he had trained to Victory, we indulge the Hope of future and the most signal Success; and under the Impression of a Sentiment so generally felt and expressed, we now offer to Your Royal Highness our most grateful Acknowledgments for this Proof of your Solitude and Attention to the Honour, Safety, and Prosperity of these Realms.
