His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

IT is ordered, by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majefty, that the Parliament which flands prorogued to Thurfday the Twenty-fecond of this inftant August, be further prorogued to Friday the Fourth Day of October next.

WHEREAS the Time limited by the Order of His Royal Highnefs the Prince Regent in Council of the Eighth Day of February laft, in Council of the Lighth Day of Feordary lan, prohibiting, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majefty, the transporting into any Parts out of this Kingdom of any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowsprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, or other Naval Stores, will expire upon the Eighth Day of August next: And whereas it is judged expedient for His Majefty's Service, and the Safety of this King-dom, that the faid Prohibition fhould be continued for fome Time longer, His Royal High-nefs in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majefty, and by and with the Advice of His Majefty's Privy Council, doth, therefore, hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no Perfon or Perfons wholoever do at any Time, for the Space of Six Months from the faid Eighth Day of August next, prefume to transport into any Parts out Auguit next, pretume to transport into any Parts out of this Kingdom any Pig-Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpentine, Anchors, Ca-bles, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bowfprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, or do fhip or lade any Pig-

Iron, Bar-Iron, Hemp, Pitch, Tar, Rofin, Turpen-tine, Anchors, Cables, Cordage, Mafts, Yards, Bow-fprits, Oars, Oakum, Sheet-Copper, Sail-Cloth or Canvas, or other Naval Stores, on board any Ship or Veffel, in order to transporting the fame into any Parts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permiffion Farts beyond the Seas, without Leave or Permittion firft being had and obtained from His Majefty or His Privy Council, upon Pain of incurring the Forfeitures inflicted by an Act paffed in the Thirty-third Year of His Majefty's Reign, initialed "An "Act to enable His Majefty to reftrain the Expor-"toring of News] Steepen and Here and Here tation of Naval Stores, and more effectually to prevent the Exportation of Salt-Petre, Arms, and "Ammunition, when prohibited by Proclamation " or Order in Council:" But it is nevertheles His Royal Highnefs's Pleafure, that nothing herein con-Koyal Highnels's Fleature, that nothing herein con-tained shall extend, or be construed to extend, to any of His Majesty's Ships of War, or any other Ships or Vessels or Boats in the Service of His Majesty, or employed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ordnance, or by the Commissions of His Majesty's Navy; nor to prevent any Ship or Veffel from taking or having on board fuch Quantities of Naval Stores as may be neceffary for the Ufe of fuch Ship or Veffel during the Courfe of her intended Noyage, or by Licence from the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or the Commiffioners of the Admiralty for the Time being ; nor to the Exportation of the faid feveral Articles to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards or Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonies and Plan-tations in America or the Welt Indies, or to Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settle-ments on the Coaft of Africa, or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies : Provided that upon the Ex-portation of any of the faid Articles for the Pur-pofes of Trade to Ireland, or to His Majefty's Yards and Garrifons, or to His Majefty's Colonics and, Plantations in America or the Weit Indies, or to the Island of Newfoundland, or to His Majefty's Forts and Settlements on the Coaft of Africa. or to the Island of St. Helena, or to the British Settlements or Factories in the East Indies, the Exporters of fuch Articles do first make Oath of
