AT the Court at York-House, the 6th of September, 1811,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

THEREAS by an Act passed in the Forty-fixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled " An Act for making additional and further Pro-" visions for the effectual Performance of Quaran-" tine," it is amongst other Things enacted, that it shall and may be lawful to and for His 'Majesty, his Heirs or Successors, by his or their Order or Orders in Council, notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette, to prohibit all Persons, Ships, Boats, and Vessels whatsoever, from going, under any Pretence whatsoever, within the Elimits of any Station which by His Majesty, his Heirs or Successors, by any such Order or Orders in Council, has been or may be affigued for the Performance of Quarantine by any Ships or Vessels without clean Bills of Health, and that if any Person whatsoever, after fach Notification or Publication of any fuch Order or Orders in Council, shall prelume, under any Pretence whatsoever, to go with any Ship, Boat, or Vessel within the Limits of any fuch Storion, he or freshall, for every fuch Offence, forfeit and pay the Sum of Five Hundred Pounds: And whereas by His Majesty's Order in Council, bearing Date the Fifth of April One thoufand eight hundred and five, it is directed that a feparate and distinct Place shall be appointed and marked out with Yellow Buoys, for the Performance: of Quarantine at the Motherbank by certain Vessels' therein described, having clean Bills of Health, and by all Ships of War, Transports, and other Ships in the actual Service of Government, under the Command of commissioned Officers of His Majesty's Navy, coming from the Places therein in that Behalf mentioned, and not being furnished with clean Bills of Health, which Place was appointed and marked out with Yellow Buoys accordingly : And whereas

His Majesty, in pursuance of the Powers vested in him by the said Act, was pleased, by his Order in Council of the Twenty-first of July One thousand eight hundred and fix, to order, and it was thereby ordered, that no Persons, Ships, Vessels, or Boats whatfoever, other than the Vessels or Boats belonging to the Superintendant of Quatantine or his Affiftant, or other Boats regularly employed under the Authority of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Cultoms in the Quarantine Service, fliould go, under any Pretence whatfoever, within the Limits of the Place to marked out, except in Cales of special Necessity and Emergency, and with Permission first had and obtained from the Superintendant of Quarantine at the Motherbank, or his Affiftant; and it was thereby further ordered, that all Ships and Veffels, being furnished with clean Bills of Health, and Boats liable to Quarantine, which might be ordered to perform the faint at the Motherbank, should come to perform the tame at the mounterpank, mount come to Anchor within the Compais of the faid Broys, in fuch Place or Places as froud be directed by the Superintendant of Quarantuse or his Allitant, and should be kept separate and apart from His Mariely's Ships of War, Transports, and Vessels in the Service of Government, and not having clean Bills. of Health, which might be performing Quarantine as aforefaid within the Compaty of the laid Tellow. Buoys: And whereas it hath been represented that the Space to marked out on the Motherbank, within which Ships under Quarantine are to be moored, was more extensive than was necessary for any Number of Ships which it was probable would have occasion to be there at one Time, and that the Extent of the Space to marked out rendered it extremely difficult, with the Wind at gertain; Points of the Compals, for Veffels which might, not be subject to Quarantine to avoid passing, through Parts of that Space, and thereby subpassed in the Forty-sixth Year of His Majesty's

Reign, and that it would therefore be expedient that a Reduction should take place in the Limits of the Quarantine Ground at the Motherbank, by the Removal of the West Buoys placed there to the Eastward of Wotton Creek, so that Boats and other Crast may pass without going through the faid Grounds, and that the Two North or Outer Buoys should be shifted nearer to the Isle of Wight, and that, in addition to the Buoys already laid down, one should be put Midway between the East and West Inner Buoys, in order to form a more conspicuous and better Line for small Vessels to pass and repais; and that another Buoy (painted Red) should be placed as a Mark for a Burying Ground between the Two Outer Buoys; and whereas such Yellow Buoys have been fixed in the Places last abovementioned, for the Purpose of reducing the faid Quarantine Station accordingly; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Quarantine Station so appointed and marked out as last afgresaid, shall be deemed and taken to be the Station for Performance of Quarantine at the Motherbanks, within the true Intent and Meaning of the hereinbefore recited Order in Council of the Fifth of April One thousand eight hundred and five; and His Royal Highnels, is further pleased to order, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice aforesaid, that no Persons, Ships, Vessels, or Boats whatsoever, other than the Vessels or Boats belonging to the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Affistant, or other Boats regularly employed under the Authority of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs in the Quarantine Service, should go under any Pretence whatever within the Limits of the Place so marked out as last aforesaid, except in Cases of special Necessity and Emergency, and with Permission first had and obtained from the Superintendant of Quarantine, at the Motherbank, or his Affiltant; and it is hereby further ordered, that all Ships and Veffels being furnished with clean Bills of Health and Boats liable to Quarantine, which may be ordered to perform the fame at the Motherbank, shall come to Anchor within the Compals of the Buoys as herein described in such Place or Places as shall be directed by the Superintendant of Quarantine or his Assistant, and shall be kept separate and apart from His Majesty's Ships of War, Transports, and Vessels in the Service of Government, and not having clean Bills of Health which may be performing Quarantine as aforesaid, within the Compass of the said Buoys; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary Directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

W HEREAS by an Act made and passed in the Forty-sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Act for authoriting His Majesty in "Council to allow, during the present War and for Six Months after the Ratification of a Delinitive Treaty of Peace, the Importation and Exportation of certain Goods and Commodities in " neutral Ships, into and from His Majesty's Terri-tories in the West Indies and Continent of South " America;" it is enacted, that from and after the passing of the said Act, it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, his Heirs, and Successors, by and with the Advice of his and their Privy Council, to permit or to authorife the Governors of the laid Islands and Territories, in such Manner and under such Restrictions as to His Majesty, by and with the Advice of his Privy Council, shall feem fit, to permit, when the Necessity of the Case shall appear to His Majesty, with the Advice of his Privy Council, to require it, from Time to Time, during the prefent War and for Six Months after the Ratification of a Definitive Treaty of Peace, the Importation into and Exportation from any Island in the West Indies, (in which Description the Bahama Islands and the Bermuda or Somer Islands are included,) or any Lands or Territories on the Continent of South America, to His Majesty belonging, of any fuch Articles, Goods, and Commodities as shall be mentioned in fuch Order of His Majetty in Council, in any Ships or Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majelty, in fuch Manner as His Majetty, his Heirs, and Successors, by and with the Advice aforefaid, shall direct; whereupon certain Orders of Council were made on the Twelfth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and nine, the Sixteenth Day of August One thousand eight hundred and nine, the Tenth Day of January One thousand eight hundred and ten, and the Se venth Day of February One thousand eight hundred and ten, which Orders were made to continue in Force for a limited Time: And whereas it appears at prefent to be necessary to permit for a further limited Time, subject to be sooner terminated, varied, or altered, as is hereinafter provided, the Importation into, and Exportation from the Islands and Territories of His Majesty in the West Indies, (including the Bahama, Islands and the Bermuda or Somer Islands,) and the Lands and Territories on the Continent of South America, to His Majesty belonging, of certain Articles, Goods, and Commodities hereinafter mentioned, in Ships or Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majesty; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, is thereupon pleased, by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Orders of Council made on the Twelfth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and nine, the Sixteenth Day of August One thousand eight hundred and nine, the Tenth Day of January One thousand eight hundred and ten, and the Seventh Day of Chetwynd. February One thousand eight hundred and ten,

shall continue and be in Force until the Thatw first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and twelve, (except as is hereinafter excepted with respect to salted, dried, or pickled Fish,) and that from and after the Fielt Day of December One thousand eight hundred and eleven, it shall be lawful for the Governor or Lieutenant Governor of any of His Majelty's Islands in the West Indies, Gio which Description the Bahama Islands and the Bermuda or Somer Islands are included;) and of any Lands or Territories on the Continent; of South America, to His Majesty belonging, to permit until the Thirty-first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and twelve, subject to be sooner terminated, varied, or altered, as hereinafter pro-vided, in Ships or Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any State in Amity with His Majesty, the Importation into the faid Islands, Lands, and Territorice respectively, of Staves and Lumber, Horses, Mules, Affes, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, and every other Species of Live Stock, and Live Provisions, and also, of every Kind of Provisions whatsoever, (Beef, Pork, and Butter excepted, and from and after the First Day of July, One thousand eight hundred and twelve, falted, dried, and pickled Fish elso excepted), and also the Exportation from the said Islands, Lands, and Territories respectively, into which such Importation as associated shall be made, of Rum and Molasses, and of any other Goods and Commodities whatfoever, except Sugar, Indigo, Cotton Wool, Coffee, and Cocoa: Provided always, That fuch Articles to to be imported, except Staves and Lumber, shall be of the Growth or Produce of the Country to which the Ship or Vessel importing the same shall belong; and that Staves and Lumber shall be imported from the Country to which the Ship or Vessel importing the same shall belong: Provided also, That such Ships or Vessels shall duly enter into, report, and deliver their respective Cargoes, and re-load at such Ports only, where regular Outtom-houtes shall have been established.

But it is His Royal Highness Pleasard nevertheless, and His Royal Highness, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majerty, and by and with the Advice aforesaid, is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that nothing hereiabefore contained thall be continued to permit, after the faid First Day of December One thousand eight hundred and eleven, the Importation of Staves, Lumber, Horses, Mules, Asses, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, Live Stock, Live Provisions, or any Kind of Provisions whatsoever as aforesaid, into any of the said Islands, Lands, or Territories, in which there shall not be, at the Time when such Articles shall be brought for Importation, the following Duties on such Articles, being of the Growth or Produce of the United States of America; mamely,

Copy of a Letter from Captain Ferris, of His Majesty's Ship Diana, addressed to Rear-Admiral Sir Thomas Williams, and transmitted by Admiral Sir Charles Cotton to John Wilson Croker Esq.

HAVE the Honour to inform you, that while flanding towards the Cordovan Light-House, in Company with His Majesty's Ship Semiramis, in the Afternoon of the 24th Instant, I discerned Four Sail inside of the Shoals at the Mouth of the River Gironde, under Escort of a National Brig of Wartin I meditated either their Capture or Deftruction, which could only be accomplished by Artifice and Promptitude, without the Sacrifice of many Lives. Stratagem was used, which had the defired Effect, as they fent a Vessel with Pilots to our Assistance, and I anchored after Dark the Two Ships midway between the Cordovan and Royan, under whole Guns the Brig had taken Refuge, and close to the Brig stationed for the Protection of the several Convoys passing either way. I dispatched Three Boats under the Orders of Lieutenant Sparrow (Second), Lieutenant Roper (Third), and Mr. Holmes Mafter's Mate, from this Ship, seconded by Four Boats under the Orders of Lieutenants-Gardner, Grace, and Nicholson, and Mr. Reneau Master's Mate, from the Semiramis, to capture or destroy the Convoy then anchored up the River, about Four Miles distant, but the Title prevented their accomplishing it until late in the Night, and at Day-light, finding the captured Veffels with the Boats far up the River beyond the Two Brigs, I determined to attack them with the Ship, but not without using the same Artifice as the preceding Night to prevent Suspicion; and so convinced were they of our being Friends that the Captain of the Port, Monsieur Michel Auguste Dubourg, Capitaine de Frégate, and commanding the in-shore Brig, came on board to offer his Services, and was not undeceived until he had ascended the Quarter-Deck. The Diana laid the outer The Diana laid the outer Brig on board, and Lieutenant Robert W. Parsons (First Lieutenant), Lieutenant Madden, First of the Royal Marines, and Mr. Mark G. Noble Boatswain, headed about Thirty Seamen and Marines (as many as could be spared by the Abfence of the Boats), and succeeded in gaining Possession of His Majesty's late Gun-Brig Teazer, mounting Twelve Eighteen Pound Carronades, and Two Long Eighteen-Pounder Guns, commanded by Monsieur Alex. Papineau, Lieutenant de Vaisfeau, with a Complement of Eighty-five Men, and without Loss on either Side. It adds to the Lustre these Officers and Men atchieved, the Humanity, they displayed to the overpowered Captives in putting them below without the Force of Arms and an unnecessary Essusion of Blood. It was at this Time that Alarm was given and the Batteries opened their Fire upon the Ships, when Captain Richardson in the Semiramis, in a Manner which characterifes the Officer and Seaman, pursued, drove on shore, and burnt, under the Guns of the Batteries, the French National Brig Le Pluvier, mounting Sixteen Guns and One Hundred and Thirty-fix Men, whose Captain, I have before spoken of, was decoyed on board.

Having obtained to the utmost the Object in View, I anchored in the Gironde, out of Gun-Shot, to repair the Damages sustained by the different

Vessels, when I was rejoined by the Boats and the captured Convoy, a List of which I have the Ho-nour to enclose. The Services I received from Captain Richardson, the Officers and Ship's Company of the Semiramis, merit my warmest Acknowledgements, and I should be committing a great Injustice to the Officers and Ship's Company I command, were I not to speak in Terms of the highest Admiration for their Steadiness and Zeal throughout the whole Affair. And could I add stronger Encomiums to one than another, it would be from the great Assistance I received from Lieutenaut R. W. Parsons and Mr. David Bevans the Master, whose unremitted Attention in piloting the Ship in the most intricate Navigation greatly tended to insure the Object of Pursuit. I also enclose you a Letter I received from Captain Charles Richardson, narrating his Atttack upon the Brig, and enclosing a List of wounded in the Affray; and I regret to add that I lost One Man overboard, after the Brig was in our full Possession.

His Majesty's Ship Semiramis, Royan SIR. Roads, August 25, 1811.

I HAVE the Honour to report to you, that as foon as the Diana ran on board the Enemy's outfide Brig, her Confort, at anchor in-shore of her, im-mediately cut her Cable and made sail for the Beach near the Battery of Royan, where she I followed in to Five Fathoms, anchorgrounded. ing with a Spring; the Broadfide was brought to bear on the Enemy's Brig, and Bow Guns on the Battery, within Grape-Shot of both.

After engaging fome Time, I found the Guns of the Enemy's Veffel almost filenced, and perceived

the Boats haul up to quit her.

At this Time the Barge, Pinnace, and Cutter rejoined me: I ordered Lieutenant Gardner with these Boats immediately to board the Enemy, which was gallantly effected after receiving his Broadfide. She proved to be the French National Brig Pluvier, of Sixteen Guns and One Hundred and Thirty-fix Men, commanded, pro tempore, by Lieutenant Page de St. Waast.

The Prize being fast on shore, the Ebb Tide running most rapidly, and my own Ship in only Twenty Feet Water, I found it necessary to take the Remainder of her People our and burn her, which, when completely effected, I made all fail to-

join you.

I have but to add in this little Affair, my Officers and Ship's Company behaved entirely to my Satisfaction; and I feel much indebted to my First Lieutenant Gardner, Second Lieutenant Grace, and Mr. Reneau Master's Mate, commanding the Boats, for the handsome Manner in which they ran alongfide the Enemy.

Lieutenant Taylor of the Marines, and Mr. Brickwood Purser, being the only Ossicers on board, were of the greatest Use, the former commanding the Main-Deck, the latter the Quarter-Deck Guns.
