Copy of a Letter from the Honourable Captain Eadogan, of His Majesty's Ship the Havannah, addressed to Rear-Admiral Sir Harry B. Neale, and transmitted by Admiral Sir Charles Cotton to John Wilson Čroker E∫q.

His Majesty's Ship Havannah, at Sea, 7th September 1811.

SOME of the Enemy's coasting Vessels having taken Shelter under a Battery of Three Twelve-Pounders on the South West Side of the Penmarks, I Yesterday Morning sent my First Lieutenant (William Hamley), with the Boats of this Ship, to spike the Gune, and bring them out or destroy them, which Service he performed, according to the fubjoined Lift, without the Loss of a Man, in a Manper that does great Credit to himself as well as all the Officers and Men employed upon the Occalion,
