His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

HIS Royal Highness the Prince Regent having been pleased, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, to appoint Robert Brownrigg, Esq; Lieutenant-General of His Majesty's Forces, to be Governor and Commander in Chief of the British Settlements in the Island of Ceylon, he this Day took the Oaths as Governor of the said Settlements.

AT the Court at *Whitehall*, the 1st of October 1811,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS it is expedient, that the Trade and Commerce to and from the Cape of Good Hope and the Territories and Dependencies thereof, which is at present carried on not only by British Ships and Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any Country or State in Amity with His Majesty, should from the Day herein-after mentioned, be carried on in British Ships and Vessels only, and the Permission that has been granted by an Order of His Majesty in Council of the 12th April 1809, for Foreign Ships and Vessels to carry on the said Trade and Commerce, should cease and determine; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that every

Thing in the said Order contained, which permits Ships and Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any Country or State in Amity with His Majesty, to enter into the Ports of the said Settlement of the Cape of Good Hope, and of the Territories and Dependencies thereof, and to carry on Trade and Traffic with the Inhabitants of the said Settlement and of the Territories and Dependencies thereof, and to import and export to and from the Ports of the said Settlement, and of the Territories and Dependencies thereof, any Goods, Wares, or Merchandize whatsoever, shall be and the same is hereby, from and after the 12th Day of April 1812, revoked and determined.

Provided however, that nothing in this Order contained, shall extend or shall be construed to extend, to prevent the Entry into the Ports of the said Settlement of the Cape of Good Hope, and of the Territories and Dependencies thereof, of any Ships or Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any Country or State in Amity with His Majesty, which may resort thither for Repairs or Refreshment, in which Case a Part of the Cargoes of such Ships and Vessels may be permitted to be disposed of, for the Purpose of defraying the Expence of such Repairs or Refreshment, nor to prevent the Entry into the said Ports of any Vessels belonging to the Subjects of any Country or State in Amity with His Majesty laden with Provisions, and which shall be furnished with a Licence from the Governor of the Cape of Good Hope, permitting such Importation, which Licence he is hereby empowered to grant; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, are to give the necessary Directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

SUPERIOR CLASS OF SHIPWRIGHT APPRENTICES.




