THE Corporation for preserving and improving the Port of Dublin, Give Notice, that a Floating Light is preparing to be moored on the North West End of the Kish Bank; its Bearings will be by Compass. The Obelisk over Dalkey Island, W. by N. Bray Head, W. S. W. and Howth Head, N. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.

It will be illuminated by Three Lanterns, hoisted on Three Masts, placed at equal Distances in the Vessel, the Centre one a few Feet higher than the other Two. The Lanterns will be lighted on Saturday the 16th of November next, and will continue to be Lit in future from Sun-Set to Sun-Rise.
