By virtue of the Authority in me vested, and in conformity with an Ordinance of the 23d May, and an Edict of the 12th August 1800, I do hereby make known, that, in compliance with a Petition delivered in, I have permitted and granted that the Trustee-Estate of Horatio Herbert, Messrs.
