SCHOOL OF PHYSIC IN IRELAND.

Whereas by an Act of Parliament, passed in the Fortieth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for repealing an Act, passed in the Twenty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, intituled 'An Act for establishing a complete School of Physic in this Kingdom;' and also for repealing an Act, passed in the Thirty-first Year of His present Majesty, intituled 'An Act to explain and amend an Act for establishing a complete School of Physic in this Kingdom, and also for extending and enlarging the Powers of the President and Fellows of the King and Queen's College of Physicians, and establishing a complete School of Physic in this Kingdom;" it is enacted,

"That every Professorship mentioned in this Act shall become vacant at the End of every Seventh Year from the Date of the Election;" and whereas it is further enacted, "that previous to every Election, either of the King's Professors or of the University Professors, unless it shall be thought proper to continue the same Professors, Three Months Notice shall be given in the Dublin and London Gazettes of such Election, &c."

And whereas the Period of the Tenure of the King's Professorship of the Practice of Medicine on the Foundation of Sir Patrick Dunn, now held by Whitty Stokes, M. D. will shortly expire; the aforesaid President and Fellows of the King and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland have directed, and do hereby publish, direct, and give Notice, that the Election of the King's Professor of the Practice of Medicine in the City of Dublin, on the Foundation of Sir Patrick Dunn, will be held at the House of the Provost of Trinity College, Dublin, on Thursday the 6th Day of February 1812, after such Examination as the Electors may require, which will begin at the Hour of Twelve o'Clock at Noon of said Day.

The following Emoluments and Advantages attend this Professorship. The Professor will receive the yearly Sum of 160l. (to commence at the Time of his Election); and also may charge reasonable Fees to be paid by all such Persons as attend his Lectures. The said Fees to be paid on Admission, and to be from Time to Time regulated by the King and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland.

The Lectures are to commence on the first Monday in November, and to continue until the End of April, and are to be given Four Days in the Week at least, in Sir Patrick Dunn's Hospital; they are also to be delivered in the English Language, unless it shall be otherwise ordered by the President and Fellows of the said King and Queen's College of Physicians.

This Professorship is open to Persons of all Nations professing their Faith in Christ, provided they shall have taken Medical Degrees, and will become vacant at the End of Seven Years from the Date of the Election, but at the Expiration of the said Seventh Year, the same Professor may be again elected. The Electors are bound to the strictest Impartiality, by an Oath required by the said Act to be taken by every Elector previous to the Election.

It is desired, that all Persons intending to offer themselves as Candidates for said Professorship, do send their Names, and also an Account of the Places
