## A PROCLANIATION.

WIIEREAS the Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Trelfitr Diy of this instant November, We, in the Nume and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of Ilis Majesty's Privy Council, do herehy publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Twelfth Day of this instant November, to Tuesday the Serenth Day of January next; and We have given Order to the Lord IIigh Chancellor of that, Part of the Erited Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland caliced Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do ferther hereby, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice aloresati, pu'stish and dechare, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Seventh Day of Jamuary next, be held and, sit for the Dispatch of divers urgent aud important 1 fiain ; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Kinights, Citizens, and Burtresses, and the Commissioners for Shares and Burghs of the lfouse of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly, at Westnineter, on the said Beventh Day of January next.

## PRESENT, <br> His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

 HEREAS the Time limited by the Order of 1 Iis Royal Ifighness the Prince Regent, $i^{n}$ Council, bearing Date the Eighth Day of Fe.
bruary last, for the Payment of the Bounties for the Encouragement of Seamen and Landmen to enter intu Mis Majesty's Royal Nary, and the Rewards for discovering Seanen who may conceal themsclves, so that such Seanen should be taken for Mis Majesty's Service, and also the Rewards to Persons who should procure the voluntary Sersice of Able and Ordinary Scanten and Lamdmen fit for His Majesty's Naral Service, and should convey such Seamen and Landmen on board any of His Majesty's Ships and Vessels, or to any of His Majesty's Sca Officers employed in raising Men, will expire on the Thirty-first Day of December next, which Bounties and Reryards are as follows; that is to say, '1o every Able Seaman, not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Tirenty Years, who should enter himself to scere in His Majesty's Itogal Navy, a Kounty of Five Pounds; ant to every Ordinary Seaman so entering himself; and not above the Age of Fifty nor under the Age of Twenty Years, a Bomnty of Two Pounds Ten Shillines; to every Able-bodicd Landman, not above the Age of Thirty-five nop under the Age of Eighteen Years, so entering himself, a Bounty of Thirty Shillings; to every Person or Persons who shall discover any Able or Ordinary Seaman or Scamen who may have concealed him or themostves; so that such Seaman or Seamen shall be taken for Mis Majesty's Service by any of His Majesty's Officer: employed to raise Men, a Reward of Three Pounds for erery such Able Sciman, and Fifty Shillings for every such Ordinary Seaman fit to serve on board His Majesty's Ships; to any Person or Persons who shall procure the coluntary Service of Able or Ordinary Seamen or Landmen fit for His Majesty's Service, and shall convey them on board any of His Majesty's Ships and Yessels, or to any of His Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men, a lieward of Three Guineas for every such Able Semman, 'Iwo Guineas for every such Ordinary Scamme, and One Guinea for erery such Landman, together with an $A 1$ lowance at the Rute of One Penny per Mile for each Able Seaman; Ordinary Scaman, and Landman, for every Mile such Men may respectively travel to the ncarest of His Majesty's Ships of War, or цuetrest Place of Residence of any of Hism Majesty's Sea Officers employed in raising Men,
