A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE P. R.

WHEREAS the Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the Twelfth Day of this instant November, We, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said Twelfth Day of this instant November, to Tuesday the Seventh Day of January next; and We have given Order to the Lord High Chancellor of that Part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do further hereby, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the Advice aforesaid, publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall, on the said Seventh Day of January next, be held and sit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important Affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said Seventh Day of January next.

Given at the Court at Whitehall, the Eighth Day of November One thousand eight hundred and eleven, in the Fifty-second Year of His Majesty's Reign.
