Each District will be put up separately at the Sum above set opposite thereto, which, if there be no Bidding, will be gradually abated down to a certain Point, or till a Bidding shall be made. The highest Bidder will be declared the Farmer, and will be required to pay down immediately, in Bank Notes, One-Eighth Part of the Annual Rent as a Deposit; but if no sufficient Bidding shall be made for any District, it will be withdrawn.

And it is intended, that the Districts shall not be put up in the Order above stated, but in any other which the Commissioners of Stamps may think fit, and which will not be declared before the Time of letting.

And no Persons licensed to let Horses for the Purpose of travelling Post, nor any one for their Use, can be admitted to contract for any of the said Duties.
