WHEREAS the time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council of the Nineteenth day of July last, for prohibiting the exportation out of this Kingdom, or carrying coastwise, Gunpowder or Salt Petre, or any sort of Arms or Ammunition, will expire upon the Eighth day of February next; and whereas it is judged expedient for His Majesty's service and the safety of this Kingdom, that the said pro-hibition should be continued for some time longer; His Royal Highness, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, prohibit, and command, that no person or persons whatspever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's service) do at any time during the space of Six Months (to commence from the said Eighth day of February next,), presume to transport into any parts out of this Kingdom, or carry coastwise, any Guppowder or Salt Petre, or any sort of Arms or Ammunition, or ship or lade any Sunpowder or Salt Petre, or any sort of Arms dr. Mamunition, on board any ship or vestel, in order to transporting the same into any parts beyond the seas, or carrying the same coastwise, without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty, or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties inflicted by an Act passed in the Twenty-ninth Year of Ilis late Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to empower His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Salt "Petre, and to enforce the Law for empowering "His Majesty to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, or enty Sort of Arms or Ammunition, and also to expower His Majesty to restrain the "carrying Coastwise of Salt Petre, Gunpowder, or

" any Sort of Arms or Ammunition;" and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great. Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.

But it is nevertheless His Royal Highness's pleasure, that nothing herein contained shall extend, or be constined to extend, to any of His Majesty's thips of war, or any other ships or ves-sels or boats in the service of His Majesty, or em-ployed or freighted by His Majesty's Board of Ord-
