

7. That his Majesty will leave to the City, the free enjoyment of the Bridge over the River, with all its Bourges, Villages, and Countrey-towles.

Granted.

8. That his Majesty will Grant an Assize for what is past, without any exception, and will comprehend therein, the Prince Palatine of Veldenz.

9. That his Majesty will permit them to build places to lodge the Troops in; that are to be in Garrison.

Granted.

10. That the Kings Troops shall enter the Town at four a clock this afternoon.

### To the KING.

Dread Sir,

Your Majesties Loyal Subjects of the Grand Jury, of this your ancient County Palatine of Chester, at the Assize held for the said County, September 19. in the 33 year of your Majesties Reign

Humbly Addressing,

**P**RESUME not Sir, to God and the World, our thankful Sense of your Majesties Princely tenderness and condescension manifested in your Declaration, dated the eighth of April last; which very observably stayed the contemptuous contagion that began to infect the credulous and unstable; and confirmed your Majesties active care of the safety and satisfaction too, of your meanest Subject, in your constant pious Resolution, to preserve and promote inseparable (with the Properties and Privileges of your People) the true Reformed Protestant Religion, agreeable to the Word of God, and usage of the Primitive Church, now professed in the Church of England, guarded by many necessary Statutes of this Realm; and to the further consideration of your several Parliaments, never omitted by your Majesty to be principally recommended, with whose Defence and Protection, under God your Majesty is immediately in your Dominions intrusted; and in preservation whereof in Doctrine and Discipline, undoubtedly resteth the best support of your Crown and Dignity; because both her Principles and Practice teach and Enjoy, without contradiction, Loyalty and Submission to our Rightful Prince, whose Sacred Person (with all the just Rights and Privileges of this Hereditary Monarchy) we resolve to the uttermost to defend, against all Treasonable, and Seditious Practices and Attempts whatsoever, striving to make all Resolutions of Duty, and Honour to the Memory and Posterity of that Glorious Majesty your Royal Father, whose indelible Love and Faithfulness to his People, and his acts of Confidence and Suffering for us, together with your own, cannot be exceeded, and should not be forgotten. 'Tis by your Majesties Sovereign Authority and Example we acknowledge that things are done in Tune, Arbitrary Power employed; and the Royal Standard by Law and Right, is the prescribed Measure and ultimate Rule of all your Subordinates, to the secure happiness of every private Subject, your Majesty's love of Parliament, and the impartial execution of your Laws; as well as our of Parliament, being a sure means to preserve your Majesties Person and Government, in due Honour and Esteem, bringing the wheel of Justice over, all invidious Offenders, whose Inhumane

ness and witchcraft of Idolatry and Rebellion, turn all acts of Grace into waspness; although your Majesties Superlative Clemency and Mercy, in taking away both the punishment and reproach of former miscarriages, are sufficient to overcome the most inveterate Papist and Phanatick, Our boldness herein, for which we implore Your Majesties wonted Grace, proceeds not so much from the example of Men, as our just detestation of popular Clamor, and tumultuous rudeness, arrogating the reputation of Zeal and the publick sense to a second hazard of the best constituted Government, and Reformed Church in the Christian World, by civil Dissentions, which are always most dangerous, as your Royal Father in His Troubles observed; when Religious Pretensions are made the ground of Faction. and the pretence of Reforming, becomes a vindication of Schismatick Audacity and Conscientious Disobedience; making us afraid to be twice deceived and destroyed by the same Methods: which your Majesties Declared Resolution, and the resolute Loyalty, and clear Affections of your good Subjects, will, we hope, effectually frustrate, and by Gods assistance preserve Unity, Peace, and Concord in your Majesties Dominions.

So we humbly and heartily pray, and that God will in all parts miraculously protect and bring you, back to us, as a Sheep without a Shepherd, would bless you from the strivings of unwise Men, with constant success against all your enemies, visible and secret; that your Reign over us may be long and prosperous; and that your Royal Race and lawful Heirs may adorn this Throne for ever.

We Your Majesties most Loyal Subjects of the second Inquest of the same County, at the same Assize, heartily and cheerfully say Amen, and join with the Grand Jury in this Address.
