**T**HIS day, the Lords being met; a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, for declaring His Majesty's Royal*

*Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for making Provision for the better Support of His Majesty's Household during the Continuance of His Majesty's Indisposition.

An Act for granting to His Majesty a certain Sum for defraying the Expences incident to the Assumption of the personal Exercise of the Royal Authority by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty.

An Act for the Regulation of His Majesty's Household, and enabling Her Majesty the Queen to meet the increased Expence to which Her Majesty may be exposed during His Majesty's Indisposition, and for the Care of His Majesty's real and personal Property; and to amend an Act of the last Session of Parliament, to provide for the Administration of the Royal Authority during His Majesty's Illness.

His Excellency the Duke del Infantado has transmitted to the Marquess Wellesley, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Copy of the Decree passed by the General and Extraordinary Cortes of Spain, on the 22d day of January last, constituting a Council of Regency of Spain and the Indies, composed of His Excellency the Duke del Infantado; Don Joaquim Mosquera y Figueroa; Vice-Admiral Don Juan Maria Villavicencio; Don Ignacio Rodriguez de Ribas; and the Conde de la Bisbal.
