HIS Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to grant to the Honourable and Reverend Richard Bruce Stopford, Master of Arts, the place and dignity of a Prebendary of His Majesty's Free Chapel of St. George, in the Castle of Windsor, void by the death of Doctor John Hallam.

His Royal Highness has also been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to present the Reverend Verney Peter Littlehales, Master of Arts, to the Canoury or Prebend of Durham, founded on the Collegiate Church of Southwell, in the county of Nottingham, and Diocese of York, void by the promotion of Doctor William Jackson, to the see of Oxford.

His Royal Highness has also been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to grant to the Reverend Thomas Gaisford, Master of Arts, the office or place of Reader or Professor of Greek in the University of Oxford, the same being void by the resignation of Doctor William Jackson.
