THIS day, the Lords, being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Yeoman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, for, declaring His Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read, and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords, therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:*

An Act to amend an Act of the Fiftieth Year of His present Majesty, for granting a Sum of Money to be raised by Excise upon Bitter, to be advanced and applied in the Manner and upon the Terms therein mentioned, for the Relief of the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies.

An Act to repeal an Act passed in the Thirtieth and Fortieth Years of His present Majesty, for establishing certain Regulations in the Offices of the House of Commons; and to establish other and further Regulations in the said Offices.

An Act to alter and amend an Act, passed in the Fifty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for the Relief of certain Insolvent Debtors in England.

An Act to repeal an Act, of the Twenty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for better securing the Duties on Coals, Culm, and Cinders, and making other Provisions in lieu thereof; and for requiring Ships in the Coal Trade to be measured.

An Act for extending the Laws for preventing the Embezzlement of His Majesty's Naval Ordnance, and Victualling Stores to Ireland.

An Act for embanking and draining certain Lands adjoining the River Wad, in the Parishes of Steeple cum Stansgate and Saint Lawrence, in the County of Essex.

An Act for vesting in the Clerk of the Peace of

the County of Stafford, the Accommodation of His Majesty's Judges at the Assizes, and for maintaining and supporting the same; and for amending an Act of His present Majesty, for building a new Shire Hall for the said County.

An Act to continue and amend Two Acts of the Tenth and Thirtieth Years of His present Majesty, for amending and widening the Road from Saint Stephen's Gate, in the County of the City of Norwich, to the Windmill in the Town of Walton, in the County of Norfolk.

THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed money for the payment of Half-Pay to Sea Officers from the 1st July to the 31st December 1811, according to His Majesty's Establishment on that behalf, these are to give notice, that the several payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at ten o'clock in the morning, on the following days, viz.

On Monday the 9th March, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.

After which the list will be recalled the first and third Wednesdays in every month, that all persons may then and there attend to receive what may become payable to them, and not only bring with them the affidavit required, touching their not having enjoyed the benefit of any public employment either at sea or on shore, during the time they are to be paid their Half-Pay, but also to produce certificates that they have subscribed to the Test, and taken the Oaths of Allegiance; required by Act of Parliament to His present Majesty; and in case any of the said Officers should not be able to attend themselves, but employ Attornies for that purpose, that the said Attornies do produce the like certificates and affidavits from the persons they are employed by.

Where the Officers are abroad on leave, their agents are to produce attested copies of such leave, before the Half-Pay can be paid.

And as by Act of Parliament, passed in the thirty-fifth year of His present Majesty's reign, entitled, "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious Method for the Payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive Half-Pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near to the place of his residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, in London, to have such Half-Pay paid at or near the place of his residence, in the manner pointed out by the said Act;" notice is hereby further given, that the Half-Pay, ending the 31st day of December 1811, will commence paying on the 9th March; and all persons desirous of having their Half-Pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.
