VICE-ADMIRAL SIR EDWARD PELLEW has transmitted to John Wilson Croker, Esq; a letter from Captain Sir Peter Parker, of His Majesty's ship the *Menelaus*, giving an account of the boats of that ship having, under the directions of Lieutenant Rowland Mainwaring, captured, on the 29th of February, near the bay of Frejus, a new French brig of war called the *St. Joseph*, pierced for sixteen guns, but none mounted; on her first voyage from Genoa to Toulon, laden with naval stores. The brig was moored within pistol-shot of a battery, (to which she had hawsers fast,) and flanked by another, as also by musketry from the shore, notwithstanding which the service was performed without a man being either killed or wounded on our side. One of the enemy's batteries is stated to have suffered severely from the fire of the launch of the *Menelaus*.
