PRESENT,

The Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS it hath been represented, that there is no longer any necessity for continuing the quarantine, which was laid by Order of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, bearing date the fourth day of October one thousand eight hundred and ten, on all ships one thousand eight hundred and ten, on an snips and vessels coming directly or circuitously from, or having touched at, the Havannah, or any other port in the Island of Cubas; it is therefore or-dered, that the said Order in Council, of the fourth day of October one thousand eight hundred and ten, be, and the same is hereby, revoked: And the Bight Honourable the Lords Commissioners of Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Com-manders in Chief for the time being of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
