Paris, Oliob. 31. Our Letters from Court tell us, That the 19th Inflant, the King gave Audience at Ersisheim, to 30 Deputies from the Swiffe Cantons; Upon their first arrival, they were Compli-mented by the Master of the Ceremonies, and afterwards in the King's Name, by the Narelchal de Belfonds, and the Marqueis d' Angeau; and when they were brought to the King, he received them with great Kindnefs, and took them all by the Hand. That the 23 about three a Clock after Dinner, the King, Queen, the Dauphin, the Dauphine's, the Duke and Dutchess of Orleans, being all in one Coach, artived at Strasburg: Without the Gates of the Town, the Marquels de Chamilly, the Governor, prefented to his Majefty the Magifirates in a Body, who delivered to the King the Keys of the City, and made their Submiffions to him. The Deputies of the Clergy have had feveral Meetings, and have made choice of the Arch-Bilhops of Rheims, and of Parn, to be Prefidents of their Affembly.

and Government, as it is now by Law established, both in Church and State, against any Opposition what, ocver; defiring nothing more than to live Duuful Subjects; un-, der your tess of Governments, and due true Sons of the exaitest of all Reformed Churches, the present Church of England; till then to evince our selves,
