A PROCLAMATION

For further continuing the Permission to all Common

Brewers, or Retailers of Beer or Ale, to make use of Sugar in brewing Beer in Great Britain.

GEORGE, P. R.

HEREAS, by an Act passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled An Act to allow the use of sugar in brewing bear in Great Britain," it was enacted, that in case His Majesty at any time after the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and twelve, should in His Royal discretion judge it to be for the benefit and advantage of His kingdom to permit common brewers, or retailers of beer or ale, to make use of brown or Muscovado sugar in the brewing or making of beer, ale, or worts, then and in such case it should and might be lawful to and for His Majesty, by His Royal Proclamation or Proclamations, be issued by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to be published from time to time in the Council, to be published from time to time in the London Gazette, to permit and suffer all common brewers and retailers of beer, ale, or worts in Great Britain, (but not any particular common brewers or retailers of beer, ale, or worts,), at any time or times, not less than thirty days from the date of such Proclamation, to make use of brown or Muscovado sugar in the brewing or making of beer, ale, or worts, until forty days after the then next meeting of Parliament, under, subject, and according to the rules, regulations, restrictions, and according to the rules, regulations, restrictions, and provisions, fines, penaltics, and forfeitures contained and provided in and by the said Act: And whereas We, acting in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, do judge it for the benefit and adaforementioned, We are thereupon pleased by this Proclamation, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to permit and suffer, and do hereby permit and suffer, all common brewers and retailers of beer, ale, or worts in Great Britain at any time at the state of the tain, at any time or times, not less than thirty days from the date of this Proclamation, to make use of brown or Muscovado sugar in the brewing or making of beer, ale, or worts, until forty days after the next meeting of Parliament, under, subject; and according to the rules, regulations, restrictions, and provisions, fines, penalties, and forfeitures contained and provided in and by the said Act.

in Council, bearing date the eighth day of November last, for the payment of the bountes for the encouragement of seamed and landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and the rewards for discovering seamen who may conceal themselves, so that such scamen should be taken themselves, so that sach scamen should be taken for His Majesty's service, and also the rewards to persons who should procure the voluntary service tof able and ordinary seamen and landmen fit for His Majesty's Naval Service, and should convey such seamen and landmen on board any of His Majesty's ships and vessels, or to any of His Majesty's sea officers employed in raising men, will jesty's sea officers employed in raising men expire on the thirty-first day of December next, which bounties and rewards are as follows; that is to say, To every able seaman, not above the age of fifty nor under the age of twenty years, who should enter himself to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, a bounty of five points; and to every ordinary seaman so entering himself, and not above the age of fifty nor under the age of twenty years, a bounty of two figureds ten shillings; to every able-bodied landman, not above the age of thirty-five nor under the age of eighteen years, so entering himself, a bounty of thirty shillings; to every person or persons who shall discover any able or ordinary seamen or seamen who may have concealed him or them-sclves, so that such seaman or seamen shall be taken, for His Majesty's service by any of His Majesty's officers temployed to raise mon, a reward of three pounds for every such able seaman, and fifty shillings for every such ordinary seaman fit to serve on board His Majesty's ships; to any person or persons who shall procure the voluntary; service, of able or ordinary seamen or landmen fit for His Majesty's service, and shall convey them on hoard any of His Majesty's ships or vessels, or to any of His Majesty's sea offi-cers, employed in raising men, a reward of three guineas for every such able scaman, and two guineas for every such ordinary seaman, and one guinta-for every such landman, together with an al-lowance at the rate of one penny per mile for each able seaman, ordinary seaman, and land-man, for every nile such man, may respectively man, for every mile such man may respectively fravel to the nearest of His Majesty's slips of war, or nearest place of residence of any of His Majesty's sea officers employed in raising men, provided such man shall be found hit for His Maprovided such man shall be found fit for His Alaicsty's service, and there shall not be reason to suppose that he is an apprentice: And whereas it is expedient, that the said several bounties, rewards, and travelling allowance should be continued to be paid for sometime longer.
