WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-first year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the Abolition and Regulation of certain Offices in the Customs," the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury for the time being, or any three or more of them, are authorized, whenever it shall appear to them to be expedient and proper, to extend the provisions of the said Act to any of the ports of Great Britain, and to the officers, clerks, and other persons employed in the service of the Customs at any such ports;

CONTRACT FOR BUILDING FIR FRIGATES.

THE Principal Officers and Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy do hereby give notice, that on Wednesday the 2d of December next, at one o'clock, they will be ready to treat with such persons as may be willing to contract for building

Eight Fir Frigates, to carry 38 Guns each, and Two Fir Frigates, to carry 36 Guns each.
