THE following Address has been presented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent; which Address His Royal Highness was pleased to receive very graciously:

To His Royal Highness George Prince of Wales,
REGENT of the British Empire.

WE, His Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Protestants of the county of Westmeath, most humbly approach his throne with our sincere assurance of fidelity, devotion, and attachment to his sacred person, and to his government of these united kingdoms; as directed by your Royal Highness.

Deploring, as we do, that calamity which has rendered it necessary to transfer from our beloved and revered Monarch the exercise of the royal duties, we nevertheless feel it a subject of gratitude to the Almighty Disposer of events, and of loyal congratulation to our fellow subjects, that the administration of affairs should have been vested in your Royal Highness; whose government in this most difficult and awful crisis, has been marked by the steady maintenance and support of those most sacred principles of our constitution, which have placed your illustrious house on the throne of these realms, and which (under the blessing of Providence) have exalted them to a degree of liberty, prosperity, and public happiness, unparalleled in the history of nations.

Zealously attached to these principles, we most dutifully approach your Royal Highness, and respectfully submit our opinions upon one of the many important points which now press forward for consideration.

Unwilling to agitate the public mind, or to increase the already too great ferment created by repeated discussions and declarations from various quarters, upon the claims of our Roman Catholic fellow subjects, we have hitherto abstained from the public expression of our sentiments upon this most interesting subject; but when we see lan-

guage of petition converted into that of demand, when that which was requested humbly as a boon, is required peremptorily as a right, we deem it a duty we owe to our country, ourselves, and our posterity, to assemble, and thus make public declaration of our sentiments and feelings; and the more so, as it has actually been assumed and asserted (even in Parliament), that the great body of Protestants in Ireland are favourable to the unqualified removal and repeal of all disabilities now affecting the Roman Catholics.

We are influenced by no illiberal or bigotted spirit of exclusion or oppression; most gladly should we accede to the extension of every privilege, the removal of every disability, consistent with the perfect safety of those establishments in Church and State, under which we have enjoyed security and increasing prosperity for so long a period.

But when the Roman Catholics allow themselves to be urged on to claim unqualified concession, unmodified extension of every privilege, at the same time refusing to submit their establishment to those wholesome ties, by which ours is connected with the State, we then deem it our duty to declare, that such extension of privilege is absolutely incompatible with the spirit and security of the British constitution, especially as tending to subvert the Protestant settlement of this country, on which we are convinced the connexion between Great Britain and Ireland, and ultimately the security of the empire, depends.

We further beg leave to submit to your Royal Highness our firm hope, that should it be deemed proper to repeal any part of those laws which now impose restriction or disability on the Roman Catholics, such repeal may be so guarded, as to afford full and perfect security to our establishment, which we consider vitally interwoven with the welfare and stability of the Protestant state, and to protect it from all dangerous innovations and encroachments.

We dutifully and gratefully approach your Royal Highness as our guardian and our protector; and we place the most implicit reliance and perfect confidence on your Royal Highness's character, firmness, and constancy, which have been proved to be superior to the specious delusions of theory, the

insidious machinations of party, and the violent assault of faction.

Extract of a Letter from Captain Swan, of His Majesty's sloop the *Bellefleur*, addressed to Captain Serrell, of the *Helder*, and transmitted by Rear-Admiral Hope to John Wilson Croker, Esq.

His Majesty's Sloop Bellefleur, off Romsoe, 30th October, 1812.

IN executing your orders last evening to protect the rear of convoy, I beg leave to acquaint you that Mr. James Turnbull, Acting Master of this sloop, in the Yawl, boarded and captured in a very gallant manner, after a short but spirited resistance, a Danish row-boat, with a lieutenant and fifteen men, armed with two two-pounders, small-arms, &c. The Danes had five men badly wounded.

THAMES DRAINAGE.

WHEREAS great injury hath been for some time past, and still is, sustained by many of the owners and occupiers of land adjacent to the River Thames (sometimes called the River Isis), in the Parishes of and Townships of Lechlade, Inglesham, Lower Inglesham, Upper Inglesham, Kempford, Hamington, Hamington Wick, Marston, Maiscy, Castle-Eaton, Lushill, Eisey, Water-Baton, Cricklade, St. Sampson, Chelworth, Cricklade, St. Mary, Down Ampney, Latton, Leigh, South Serney, Cerney Wick, Ashton, Keynes, Somerford, Keynes Minty, Oaksey, Crudwell and Hankerton, in the Counties of Gloucester, Berks, and Wilts, and in the borders and confines of the same, by the increase and accumulation of sand-banks, islets, and flams, and by weirs, trees, and other obstructions lying in the bed or course of the said river, and preventing the due and speedy discharge of the flood waters of the said river and adjacent country, and it would be of great advantage to the said owners and occupiers, and to the public, to have the said obstructions removed, and sufficient drains and works made and maintained for discharging the said waters, and draining the lands injured thereby.

such other powers and provisions as are usual in Commissions of Sewers, or as their Lordships shall be pleased to grant; at which meeting all land-owners and occupiers of land within the said Parishes and Townships, and other persons interested, or who may be affected by such Commission, if granted, are requested to attend.
