Charles Duke of Norfolk, E. M. Lord Lieutenant of the County of Sussex, &c. &c. &c. having received a warrant under the sign manual of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to cause to be enrolled in the local militia of the said county such number of private men to serve therein as may be necessary to complete the apportionment of the said local militia for the said county, namely, to 3212, and thereafter from time to time to cause to be filled up all vacancies or deficiencies arising in the said local militia, from men enlisting or entering into the army, navy, or marines, or as substitutes or volunteers in the regular militia, or from being appointed to be serjeants, corporals, or drummers; or from discharge, absence, desertion, death, or expiration of service; or from what other cause soever, according to the provisions of an Act passed in the 52d year of His present Majesty, intituled, "An Act for amending the laws relating to the local militia in England," so that the said local militia be kept complete to the full number of 3212 private men. Provided that so long as the number of local militia men, serving in the said county, shall, in addition to, and together with, and including the effective yeomanry and volunteers serving in the said county (exclusive of supernumeraries above the establishment of such corps serving without pay), amount to six times the original quota of the said militia of the said county, fixed under an Act passed in the 42d year of the reign of His said Majesty relating to the militia of England; no further enrolment of men for the local militia of the said county shall take place beyond what may be necessary to keep the
