

Pursuant to a Decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a Cause Smith versus Richardson, the Creditors of William Richardson, late of the Strand, Printseller, are personally, or by their Solicitors, to come in and prove their debts before Edward Morris, Esq. one of the Masters of the said Court, at his Chambers, in Southampton-Buildings, Chancery-Lane, London, on or before the 12th day of February 1813, or in default thereof they will be peremptorily excluded the benefit of the said Decree.
