

*Whitehal, November 14.* The following Address, being Signed by above 5000 Noblemen, Gentlemen, and Freeholders of the County of *Stafford*, was presented to His Majesty by the Right Honourable the Lord *Ward*, accompanied by Sir *Charles Holt*, Col. *Edward Vernon*, *Bryan Broughton*, *Thomas Lane*, *Humphrey Werley*, and *Edward Moreton* Esquires; and was received by His Majesty with His wonted Grace and Goodness.

*To the Kings most Excellent Majesty.*

The humble Address of the Noblemen, Justices of the Peace, Gentlemen, Clergy, Grand-Jury, and Freeholders of the County of *Stafford*, agreed on at the General Quarter-Sessions of the Peace held at *Stafford* the fourth of *October*, in the three and thirtieth year of Your Majesties most happy Reign.

Dread SIR,

**W**E Your Majesties most Loyal and Obedient Subjects, having with infinite satisfaction seen Your Majesties late Gracious Declaration, wherein your Majesty hath been pleased to give repeated Assurances to Your People, that you will continue to Govern according to the known Laws of this your Majesties Kingdom; to Advise with your People in frequent Parliaments; to maintain the true Protestant Religion, according to the Profession of the Church of England, and to defend us in all our just Rights and Liberties, against all Invaders whatsoever; Do in all Humility return our most hearty and unfeigned Thanks, humbly assuring your Majesty, that we will readily sacrifice our Lives and Fortunes, in the Defence of your Majesties Sacred Person, your Heirs and lawful Successors, and the Government of the Church and State, as now by Law established, against all the Plots and Designs, both of Papists and Phanaticks, and though others have appeared earlier in Addresses of this nature, none shall go before us in Zeal for your Majesties Service.

*May it please Your most Excellent Majesty,*

**W**E Your Majesties Loyal, Dutiful, and Obedient Subjects, the Mayor, Aldermen, Citizens, and other Your Loyal Inhabitants of Your ancient City of *Lincoln* (together with the Bay and Gild of the same), do humbly acknowledge to Your Majesty, that had we thought there had been any better way of expressing our Faith and true Allegiance to Your Majesties most Sacred Person, and our grateful Sense of Your excellent Government, than a peaceable and quiet Demeanor in our several Callings and Stations, an humble Submission to, and acquiescence in Your Majesties good and wholesome Laws, relating to the Government both of Church and State, and a readiness, (as oft as Your Majesty, in Your Princely Wisdom judges it fit to call Parliaments, to choose such Members as we conceive to be perfectly Devoted to Your Majesties Service, and the welfare of Church and State, as now by Law established, without intermeddling with the Calling of Dissolving of them; both which we acknowledge to be Your Majesties undoubted Rights and Prerogatives; We had certainly been in with the former of our Loyal Fellow Subjects, in our unfeigned Acknowledgments of Your Princely Care and Prudence; and in returning our humble and hearty Thanks for Your Majesties most Gracious Declaration, wherein Your Royal Intention is to Govern us according to Law, appear to plain and manifestly us, that applying but the unreasonable jealousies of ambitious, and evil-designing Men, can suspect the contrary. But since the many Loyal Addresses that have lately been Presented to Your Majesty, from most parts of this Your Kingdom, have in a manner rendered it now necessary to manifest well a verbal, and a bare Declaration of our Loyalty; We therefore humbly beseech Your Majesty to

excuse, and favourably to accept of this our hearty, though late Promise, That to the utmost of our Power we will defend Your Majesties Person, Your lawful Heirs and Successors, against all opposition whatsoever; and praying for Your Majesties happy Reign, and long Life, we have hereunto subscribed our Names, certifying our sincerity herein, as becomes, Dread SIR,  
Your Majesties most Dutiful and Obedient Subjects.

*Whitehal, Nov. 16.* This Afternoon Mr. *Frederick Harvey* was by Warrant of the Lords of His Majesties Privy Council, Committed Prisoner to *Newgate* for High Treason; he having spoken divers Treasonable and dangerous words against His Majesty and the Government; viz. That His Majesties consenting to the Tyrannical Proceedings of Convicting Dissenters, he did not question but would make Him (meaning the Kings Majesty) the Head shorter; and that he did admire the City did not secure him the last Lord Mayors day, when they had him there.

His Majesty was pleased this day in Council to order a Proclamation to be Published for restraining all His Majesties Subjects, except the *East-India* Company, to Trade to the *East-Indies*.
