WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that a most daring robbery was committed, on Monday evening the 25th January last, near the town of Alnwick, in the county of Northumberland, between the Coal-Staith and the South Turnpike-Gate, by two footpads, who stopt John Jackson, a private in the East-York Militia, by seizing the bridle of the horse on which he rode, which they cut, together with the stirrup, wounded the horse upon the shoulder, and very severely cut the man in the right leg, pulled him off the horse, and rifled his pockets.

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the said robbery, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to either one of them (except the person who actually cut and wounded the said John Jackson) who shall discover his or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
