Carlton-House, Thursday, March 4, 1813.

A CHAPTER of the Most Noble Order of the Garter having been summoned for this day, the Knights Companions, in their mantles and collars, with the Officers of the Order, in their mantles and wearing their chains and badges, at about two o'clock attended His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in his private apartment; and, being there called over by Garter King of Arms, a procession was made to the Chapter Room in the following order:

His Royal Highness the **PRINCE REGENT.**

The Prince Regent and the Knights Companions being seated, the Register (in the absence of the Chancellor) signified to the Chapter His Royal Highness's pleasure, in the name and on the behalf of the Sovereign, that the vacant stall in the Royal Chapel of St. George at Windsor, be filled.

The Knights Companions then proceeded to the election; and the suffrages being collected by the Register and presented to the Prince Regent, Arthur Marquess of Wellington, Commander of His Majesty's Forces in Spain and Portugal, was, by the command of His Royal Highness, in the name and on the behalf of the Sovereign, declared duly elected a Knight of the said Most Noble Order.

The Chapter ended, Garter called over the Knights; and a procession was made back to His Royal Highness's apartment, in the order as before.

CEREMONIAL of the Knighthood and Investiture of Admiral the Honourable Sir George Cranfield Berkeley and Major-General Sir James Leith, Knights of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath.

The Knights and Officers of the Order, attending in their mantles, collars, &c. proceeded into the presence of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, making the usual reverences, in the following order:

The Gentleman Usher of the Order, in his mantle, chain, and badge, bearing the red rod.
The Deputy Register and Secretary of the Order, in the mantle, chains, and badges of those offices.
Deputy Bath King of Arms, in the mantle, chain, and badge, with the sceptre of Bath, bearing the ribbands and badges of the Order upon a crimson velvet cushion.
The Genealogist, in his mantle, chain, and badge.
