DR. THORNTON'S BOTANICAL LOTTERY.

WHEREAS, by an Act of Parliament made and passed on the twenty-first day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven, intituled "An Act to enable Dr. Robert John Thornton to dispose of his Collection of Paintings, Drawings and Engravings, together with several Copies of certain Books therein mentioned, by way of Chances," it is amongst other things enacted, that the said collection of paintings, drawings and engravings, together with the said copies of works then unsold, should be divided and allotted, according to the schedule to the said Act annexed, and that the ten thousand prizes therein mentioned should be determined by the drawing of any State Lottery that should consist of twenty thousand Tickets or upwards, and that should be drawn in London between the first day of August one thousand eight hundred and eleven and the first day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, in pursuance of any Act or Acts of Parliament that might thereafter be passed for that purpose, if any such should be passed; and if more than one such Lottery should be appointed by any such Act or Acts to be drawn within such period, then by such of the said Lotteries as should be chosen by the said Robert John Thornton, his executors or administrators, and notified in the London Gazette forty-two days before the drawing such Lottery, and that the first ten thousand numbers that should be drawn in such State Lottery, be they either blank or prize, the numbers whereof should respectively correspond with any numbers of the Tickets of the Lottery authorised by the said Act, should respectively be, and they are thereby declared to be the prizes, in the order in which the said collection of paintings, drawings, and engravings, and the said several pieces composing the same, and the said copies of

works then unsold, were divided and allotted in the schedule to the said Act annexed: Now I, the said Robert John Thornton, have chosen and appointed, that the ten thousand prizes mentioned in the said Act shall be determined by the drawing of the next State Lottery, consisting of twenty thousand Tickets, to be drawn on the sixth day of May next, and, pursuant to and in compliance with the said Act, do hereby give notice thereof accordingly.
