THE following copy and extract of dispatches from Lieutenant-General the Honourable Sir Charles Stewart, K. B. have been received by Viscount Castlereagh, dated

*Head-Quarters, Reichenbach,
June 6, 1813.*

MY LORD,

THE enemy continued in its positions in the neighbourhood of Schweidnitz until this day, when the Armistice agreed on by the contending forces was made known. His Imperial Majesty and the King of Prussia have fixed their head-quarters at country houses near this place; General Wittgenstein's corps d'armée, with General Blücher's, remains at Schweidnitz and its neighbourhood. General Barclay de Tolly has his head-quarters here.

It appears the enemy had detached a corps, immediately preceding the Armistice, against Boistch and Bülow, and a sharp affair occurred with the former, who fell back some short distance, being greatly overpowered by numbers. The operations of the above Generals in the rear of the enemy still continued to alarm him, and to be attended with the greatest success, which probably forced him to detach.

Various partizan corps have brought in many prisoners within these few last days.

A brilliant achievement of General Czernichef's, at Halberstadt, your Lordship will hear of before this dispatch can reach you, so I do not recapitulate it.

Head-Quarters, Reichenbach, June 6, 1813.

THE Allies in a few short weeks have given two decided battles to infinitely superior numbers; no day has passed without trophies of victory arriving at the head-quarters of the army—no day has gone by without affairs or skirmishes in which they have uniformly had the advantage. Committed to a desperate battle at Lutzen, where they triumphantly stood and conquered, and from which the difficulty of getting up ammunition alone obliged them to retire, they executed the passage of the Elbe, than which no more difficult operation can be conceived, in the presence of a superior enemy, and traversed an extent of country of near three hundred miles, retiring, contending position after position, and carrying with them between six and seven hundred pieces of cannon, without losing a gun or sacrificing any of their baggage.

Westminster, June 22, 1813.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, for declaring His Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for raising the sum of twenty seven millions by way of annuities.

An Act to authorize the sellers of glass, hides, tobacco, and snuff, to charge the additional duties on any such articles ordered before, but not delivered until after the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and twelve.

An Act for amending and rendering more effectual the laws for the trials of controverted elections, and returns of Members to serve in Parliament.

An Act for the more effectual administration of the office of a Justice of the Peace within the township of Manchester and Salford, in the hundred of Salford, in the county Palatine of Lancaster, and to provide, by means of a rate on the said townships and otherwise, a competent salary to a Justice of the Peace acting within the said townships; and to enable the constables of Manchester and Salford; to take recognizances in certain cases.

An Act to enable the Company of Proprietors of the South London Water-Works to raise a further sum of money, and to alter and amend the powers of an Act passed in the forty-fifth year of His present Majesty for making the said water-works.

An Act to authorize the advancement of a certain sum of money for carrying into effects the several Acts for the improvement of the port and town of Liverpool, and to amend the said Acts.

An Act for further improving the harbour of Aberdeen.

An Act for the further improvement of the harbour of Wexford.

An Act for inclosing, draining, and exonerating from tythes lands, in the lordship of North Kelsey, in the county of Lincoln.

An Act for enlarging the powers of two Acts of His present Majesty, for embanking and draining certain low lands and grounds, in the parishes or townships of Everton Scaftworth, Gringley on the Hill, Misterton, and Walkeringham, in the county of Nottingham.

An Act for more effectually draining and improving lands within the level of Hatfield Chase, and parts adjacent, in the counties of York, Lincoln, and Nottingham.

An Act for better assessing and collecting the poor and other rates in the parish of Saint Giles, Camberwell, in the county of Surrey, and regulating the affairs thereof, for repairing or rebuilding the parish work-house, and purchasing ground for a cemetery, and for other purposes relating thereto.

An Act for altering and amending two several Acts of the thirty-fifth and forty sixth years of the reign of His present Majesty, for paving and improving the parish of Saint Mary-le-Bone, in the county of Middlesex.

An Act for paving, widening, cleansing, watching, lighting, and regulating the streets and other public places within the borough of Chepping Wycombe, in the county of Bucks, and for removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions therein.

An Act for altering and amending several Acts for repairing the road from Saint Giles's Pound to Kilbourne Bridge, and for making a new road from the Great Northern Road, at Islington, to the Edgeware-Road, near Paddington, in the county of Middlesex.

“ That the right of election in and for the town and county of the town of Galway, is in the freeholders of the said town and county of the town of Galway, and in the free burgesses and freemen thereof, such freemen having been resident in the said town and county of the town, or the liberties thereof, at the time of their election to their freedom, and also at the time of their voting:”

“ That the right of election in and for the town and county of the town of Galway, is in the freeholders of the said town and county of the town of Galway, and in the freemen of the corporation of the said town:”

‘ That upon the statement delivered in by the counsel for the said petitioners, the committee have determined, that the right of election, as set forth in the said statement, is not the right of election for the town and county of the town of Galway:’

‘ That upon the statement delivered in by the counsel for the sitting Member, the committee have determined, that the right of election, as set forth in the said statement, is the right of election for the said town and county of the town of Galway:’
