SEQUESTRATIONS IN SWEDEN.

WE the undersigned, five of the Referees appointed under and by virtue of a certain Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, made and passed in the fifty-third year of the reign of His present Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to provide for the distribution, payment, and application of certain monies and effects, refunded or paid, or to be refunded or paid, by or on behalf of the Government of Sweden, among the persons having claims thereon, in consequence of certain detentions, sequestrations, and condemnations by that Government in the years 1810, 1811, and 1812," do hereby give notice to, and require all persons, bodies politic and corporate, claiming any interest in the monies, bills, effects, and property, by the said Act vested in certain Commissioners therein named, to deliver to us, the said Referees, forthwith, by leaving the same, either personally or through their agents in London, at our Office in Broad-Street-Court, in the City of London, true and explicit statements and accounts, in writing, of the respective losses sustained by them, or those under whom they respectively claim, in consequence or by reason of the said sequestrations, detentions, or condemnations, and of their respective claims to restitution or compensation, in respect of such losses, out of the monies, effects, and property, by the said Act vested in the said Commissioners; and also to deliver to us, at the time and place aforesaid, copies of all invoices, bills of lading, policies of insurance, bills of parcels, vouchers, documents, papers, and writings; and to shew or deliver to us, when called upon for that purpose, or as we may hereafter require, the originals of such documents, for the purpose of proving and substantiating such losses and claims, such copies or original docu-
