His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

This this day ordered, by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, that his Grace the Archbishop of Canterbury do prepare a form of prayer and thanksgiving to Almighty God, for the repeated successes obtained over the French army in Spain by the allied forces, under the command of the Most Honourable Arthur Marquess of Wellington, and especially for the signal victory obtained on the 21st day of June last, in the neighbourhood of Vittoria.

And it is hereby further ordered, that His Majesty's printer do forthwith print a competent number of copies of the said form of prayer and
thanksgiving, that the same may be forthwith sent
round and read in several churches throughout those
parts of the United Kingdom called England and
Ireland.

IT is this day ordered, by His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, that every minister or preacher, as well of the Established Church in

that part of Great Britain called Scotland, as those of the Episcopal Communion, protected and allowed by an Act passed in the tenth year of Her late Majesty Queen Anne, cap. 7, intituled "An " Act to prevent the disturbing those of the Epis-" copal Communion in that part of Great Britain " called Scotland, in the exercise of their reli-" gious worship, and in the use of the Liturgy of " the Church of England," and for repealing an Act passed in the Parliament of Scotland, intituled " An Act against irregular baptisms and mar-" riages," do at some time during the exercise of the Divine Service in such respective church, congregation, or assembly, on Sunday the 1st day of August next, or on Sunday next after notice hereof shall have been received, put up prayers and thanksgivings to Almighty God, for the repeated successes obtained over the French army in Spain, by the allied forces under the command of the Most Honourable Arthur Marquess of Wellington, and especially for the signal victory obtained on the 21st day of June last, in the neighbourhood of Chetwynd.
