BY virtue of the authority in me vested, and in conformity with an ordinance of the 23d May, and an edict of the 12th of August 1803, I do hereby make known, that, in compliance with a petition delivered in, I have permitted and granted, that the Executors after the deceased Mr. Cornelius

Durant, Messrs. John Sempill and Thomas Durand, may summon by proclamation sub poena præclusi et perpetui silentii, all the known or unknown Creditors to the dealing of the said deceased Mr. Cornelius Durant, residing in European or American territories, to come forward with their demands, and enter and prove their claims, in person or by their attorneys, before the Executors, previous to the expiration of the period herein-after limited, that is to say, within one year and six weeks from the period when this proclamation shall have been recorded in the Upper Courts of the islands of St. Croix, St. Thomas, and St. John, and published three times consecutively in the London Gazette; and all such known or unknown Creditors as reside in any of the West India islands or colonies, shall come forward with their demands, and enter and prove their claims, in person or by their attorneys, before the said Executors, within three months from the date of this proclamation being recorded in the Superior and Inferior Courts of the islands of St. Croix, St. Thomas, and St. John, and notice thereof being published in the St. Croix Gazette, three times consecutively. And the aforesaid Executor shall further be bound to cause this grant to be produced in the Royal and the Loan Commissions Book-keeper's Offices to the said islands, and procure a certificate of this being compiled with; in failure of which, this proclamation shall not be valid against any claims or prerogatives of His Majesty; and all persons concerned are to take notice hereof, and so conduct themselves accordingly.
