GIOR vitterligt, At jeg, i Kraft af den nigg overdragne Myndighed, og i Overensstemmelse med en Forordning af 28de May, som en Placat af 12de August 1800, haver efter derom indkomne Ansøgning tilladt og bevilget, at de Herrer Doctor Edward Stevens, Kammerraad, C. L. Smidt og Cornelius Kortright, som Executorer efter hans Excellence afgangne Lieutenant-Gouverneur og General-Major George William Richard Harcourt, maa ved proclama sub pena praeculsi et perpetui silentii, indkalde alle beklaade alter obetruende Chitorior, efter besagde afgangne Lieutenant-Gouverneur og General-Major Harcourt, boende i Europeiske Herredømmen, at fremkomme med deres Krav og indlevere samt bevisliggiore deres Fordringer, personligen eller ved deres Fuldmægtige, for bemynte Executorer, forinden expirationen af den nu her bestemte tid, nemlig; forinden et Aar og Sex Uger, efter at dette Proclama er blevet lost i Overretterne for Oerne St. Croix, St. Thomas, og St. Jan, og trende paa hinanden følgende Gange publiceret i the London Gazette; og alle saadanne beklaade eller ubeklade Creditore, som dor paa usagen af de Vestindiske Øer eller Colonier, skal fremkomme med deres Krav, og indlevere samt bevisliggiore deres Fordringer, personligen eller ved deres Fuldmægtige, for bemynte Executorer, forinden trende maaneder fra den dato, da dette proclama er blevet lost i Oer, og Underretterne paa Oerne St. Croix, St. Thomas, og St. Jan, og Ritterretning derom, trende paa hinanden følgende Gange, bleren beklaedt i St. Croix Gazette. Og de forherneuve Executorer skal endvidere vere forpligtede, at lade denne Bevilling blive forevist i de Kongelige Laane Commissionernes Bogholder Contoirer paa besagde Oer, og erhverve Attest om, at saadan er etableret; i manglende Fald skal dette proclama ikke være gildende mod nogen af Hauss Majestats fordringer eller rettigheder; og have alle vedkommende dette at intage og sig deraf at rette.

By virtue of the authority in me vested, and in conformity with an ordinance of the 14th of August 1800, I do hereby make known, that, in compliance with a petition delivered to me, I have permitted and granted, that the Honourable Counsellor Edward Stevens, M. D., the Honourable Counsellor C. L. Smidt, and Cornelius Kortright, Esq. as Executors to His Excellency the deceased Lieutenant-Governor and Major-General George William Richard Harcourt, my predecessor by proclama sub pena praeculsi et perpetui silentii, all the known or unknown Creditors to the said deceased Lieutenant-Governor and Major-General Harcourt, residing in European or American territories, to come forward with their demands, and enter and prove their claims in person, or by their Attorneys, before the said Executors, previous to the expiration of the period herein-after limited, that is to say, within one year and six weeks from the period when this proclama shall have been recorded in the Upper Courts of the islands of St. Croix, St. Thomas, and St. John, and published three times consecutively in the London Gazette; and all such known or unknown Creditors, as reside in any of the West India islands of colonies, shall come forward with their demands, and enter and prove their claims, in person or by their Attorneys, before the said Executors, within three months from the date of this proclama being recorded in the Superior and Inferior Courts of the islands of St. Croix, St. Thomas, and St. John, and notice thereof being published in the St. Croix Gazette three times consecutively; and the aforesaid Executors, shall further be bound to cause this grant to be produced in the Royal and the Local Commissions Book-Keepers Offices to the said islands, and prepare a certificate of this being complied with; in failure of which, this proclama shall not be valid against any claim or prerogatives of His Majesty; and all persons concerned are to take notice hereof, and to conduct themselves accordingly.
