And We do further hereby, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice aforesaid, publish and dcclare, that the said Parliament shall, on the fourth day of November next, be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs : And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, arc hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said fourth day of November next.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the twentieth day of September one thousand eight

hundred and thirteen, in the fifty-third year of His Majesty's Reign.
