**A PROCLAMATION,**

*For permitting the making of Wash or Worts for Distillation, and the distilling of Spirits from Oats, Barley, or any other Corn or Grain (Wheat excepted), or from any Malt, Flour, or Bran.*

GEORGE, P. R.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament, intituled "An Act to continue, until the thirty-first day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, an Act made in the forty-ninth year of His present Majesty, to prohibit the distillation of spirits from corn or grain in the United Kingdom, and another Act made in the forty-ninth year of His present Majesty to suspend the importation of British or Irish made spirits into Great Britain and Ireland respectively, and to continue the duties on worts or wash made from sugar in Great Britain, and the duties on spirits made from sugar in Ireland," it is enacted, that in case at any time after the first day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, His Majesty should, in His Royal discretion, judge it to be for the benefit and advantage of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain, to permit the making of worts or wash from corn or grain for distillation, then and in such case it should be lawful for His Majesty, by His Royal Proclamation or Proclamations, to be issued by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to be published from time to time in the London Gazette, to permit and suffer all and every person and persons (but not any particular person or persons), at any time or times, not less than thirty days from the date of such Proclamation, to make worts or wash for distillation, and to distil spirits from oats, barley, or any other corn or grain (wheat excepted), or from any malt, flour, or bran: And whereas

Majesty, do judge it for the benefit and advantage of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain, to grant the permission aforementioned, We are thereupon pleased, by this Proclamation, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to permit and suffer, and do hereby permit and suffer all and every person and persons, at any time or times, from and after the first day of December next, to make worts or wash for distillation, and to distil spirits from oats, barley, or any other corn or grain (wheat excepted), or from any malt, flour, or bran.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, this fifth day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, in the fifty-third year of His Majesty's reign.

**A PROCLAMATION.**

GEORGE, P. R.

**W**HEREAS the Parliament stands prorogued to Monday the first day of November next, We, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued on the said first day of November next, to Thursday the fourth Day of said month; and We have given order to the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called Great Britain, to prepare a Commission for proroguing the same accordingly. And We do further hereby, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice aforesaid, publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall, on the fourth day

of November next, be held and sit for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses; and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said fourth day of November next.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the twentieth day of September one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, in the fifty-third year of His Majesty's Reign.

At the Court at Carlton-House, the 20th of September 1813,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty was pleased, by His general Order in Council of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, touching the performance of quarantine, to direct, that where any ship or vessel shall attempt to enter into any port or place in Great Britain; or the islands of Jersey, Guernsey, Alderney, Sark, or Man, whether such port or place shall have been appointed for the performance of quarantine or not, the Superintendent of Quarantine, or his Assistant, (if there shall be such Superintendent or Assistant at such port or place), or if not, the Principal Officer of His Majesty's Customs at such port or place, or such Officer of the Customs as shall be authorised by the Commissioners of the Customs, or any four or more of them, to act in that behalf, shall go off to such ship or vessel, and shall, at a convenient distance from such ship or vessel, keeping to windward, demand of the Commander, Master, or other person having charge of such ship or vessel, answers to certain preliminary questions therein set forth: And whereas His Royal Highness the Prince Regent was pleased, by His Orders in Council of the twenty-eighth of February one thousand eight hundred and eleven, and the twenty-ninth of September one thousand eight hundred and twelve, and the thirty-first of July last, to direct, that certain questions, in addition to the preliminary questions directed by His Majesty's general Order in Council of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, touching the performance of quarantine, should be put to the Commanders, Masters, or other persons having the charge or command of such ships or vessels: And whereas it is deemed expedient, that, in the case of ships or vessels coming from or having touched at any of the places mentioned in His Majesty's said Order in Council of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, as places from which it is probable that the plague, or some other infectious disease or distemper, highly dangerous to the health of His Majesty's subjects, may be brought into Great Britain; or having on

board any goods, wares, or merchandises, enumerated in the said Order, being the growth, produce, or manufacture of Turkey, or of any place in Africa, within the Streights of Gibraltar, or in the West Barbary on the Atlantic Ocean, and from any port or place in Europe without the Streights, or on the Continent of America, at which there is not a regular establishment for the performance of quarantine, which shall have been declared sufficient for that purpose by any Order of His Majesty in Council; notified by Proclamation, or published in the London Gazette; or coming from or having touched at any port or place on the Continent of America, the islands adjacent thereto, or coming from or having touched at any of the ports in the West Indies; the following questions, in addition to the said preliminary questions, should be put to the Commander, Master, or other person having the charge of such ships or vessels; viz.

"When did you sail from the port or place from whence you took on board your outward cargo; and at what places did you touch before you arrived at the port or place where you took in your present cargo?"

"Did you carry any bill of health with you to the port or place where you took in the cargo you have now on board? From what place? Were the said bills of health clean, unclean, or suspected?"

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased to order, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, that the questions above set forth, in addition to the preliminary questions directed by His Majesty's general Order in Council of the fifth of April one thousand eight hundred and five, and the Orders in Council of the twenty-eighth of February one thousand eight hundred and eleven, the twenty-ninth of September one thousand eight hundred and twelve, and the thirty-first of July last respecting the performance of quarantine, be put to the Captains, Commanders, Masters, or other persons having charge or command of ships or vessels coming from or having touched at any of the places above described and enumerated:

And His Royal Highness was further pleased to order, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice aforesaid, that such Captains, Commanders, Masters, or other persons having charge or command of such ships or vessels, shall, upon such questions being put by the Superintendent of Quarantine, or his Assistant, or Principal Officer or other Officer of the Customs, authorised by the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, or any four or more of them, to act in that behalf, give true answers to the same, in writing or otherwise, and upon oath or not upon oath, according as they shall be required by such Superintendent, or his Assistant, or Principal Officer or other Officer of the Customs, authorised as aforesaid, under such pains and penalties as are inflicted by an Act passed in the forty-fifth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for making further provision for the effectual performance of quarantine."

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General, and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief for the time being of the Isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain. *Chetwynd.*

**W**HEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that in the night of the 30th of August last, some evil-disposed person or persons did wantonly and cruelly maim and disfigure three mares belonging to Mr. Aaron Everard, of Naseby, in the county of Northampton, by cutting off the ears of all of them, and making deep gashes in the necks of two of them;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the said felony, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person or persons who actually cut and maimed the said mares), who shall discover his or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof. **SIDMOUTH.**

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of FORTY GUINEAS is hereby offered by the said Aaron Everard, to any person making such discovery as aforesaid (except as is before excepted), to be paid on the conviction of any one or more of the offenders.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed on the 2d July last, it is enacted, that there shall be allowed to British Governors, Ministers, Consuls, and Merchants, residing in foreign parts, for the maintenance of all seafaring men and boys, subjects of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, that shall be shipwrecked, captured, or by other unavoidable accident, be driven or cast away, or that shall be discharged, as unserviceable, from any of His Majesty's ships, or vessels, at such foreign ports or places where such Governors, Ministers, Consuls, or Merchants reside; and to every Master or other person, having charge of a ship or vessel, taking on board and subsisting such seafaring men and boys, in the manner expressed in the Act 31 Geo. 2. cap. 10, such sum of money per diem as the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, from time to time, shall, in their discretion, direct;

Notice is hereby given, that the Lords of the Admiralty, have, by the authority of the aforementioned Act, directed the Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, to cause the sum of one shilling and sixpence per diem, for the subsistence and passage home of each such seaman or seafaring boy, to be paid to any person or persons that may be entitled to receive the same, under the provisions of the said Act: observing, in respect to Merchants, that by the Act passed in the thirty-first of His late Majesty, intituled "An Act for the encouragement of seamen employed in the Royal Navy," &c. it is enacted, that in those foreign parts where there is not a resident Governor, Minister, or Consul, two or more British Merchants are authorised to act, in providing for such seafaring men and boys.
