Relief of Poor Widows of Commission and Warrant Officers of the Royal Navy having resolved, with the approbation of His Royal Highness, the Prince Regent, that from and after the 1st of January 1814, the pensions of Sea Officers' Widows shall be increased to, and established at, the following rates, viz.

The Widow of a Flag Officer of His . - 120 per ann; Majesty's Fleet The Widow of a Captain, superannuated, with the rank of Rear-Admiral The Widow of a Post Captain of three years standing 90 The Widow of a Post Captain under 80 three years standing The Widow of a Commander 70 The Widow of a Lieutenant, superannuated, with the rank of 60 Commander The Widow of a Lieutenant 50 40 . The Widow of a Master 40 The Widow of a Surgeon The Widow of a Purser 30 25 The Widow of a Boatswain The Widow of a Gunner 25 The Widow of a Carpenter 25 The Widow of a Second Master of a Yacht, or Master of a Naval Vessel warranted by the Navy

with the proviso, however, that those widows only shall be reputed proper objects of the Charity who have not pensions on the Ordinary Estimates of the Navy, or by any other grant from Government, and whose annual incomes, arising from their real or personal estates, or otherwise, do not amount to double the sum allowed for their respective pensions.

And it being intended that all pensions from the said Charity shall in future be paid quarterly, up to the following days, viz.
