PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

THIS day the Right Honourable Sir Vicary Gibbs, Knight, Lord Chief Baron of His Majesty's Court of Exchequer, was, by command of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his place at the Board accordingly.

AT the Court at *Carlton-House*, the 30th of November 1813,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, made and passed in the forty-sixth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for authorising His Majesty, in Council, to allow during the present war, and for six months after the ratification of a definitive treaty of peace, the importation and exportation of certain goods and commodities, in neutral ships, into and from His Majesty's territories in the West Indies and Continent of South America," it was enacted, that, from and after the passing of the said Act, it should and might be lawful for His Majesty, His heirs, and successors, by and with the advice of His and their Privy Council, to permit, or to authorise the Governors of the said islands and territories, in such manner

and under such restrictions as to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, should seem fit, to permit, when the necessity of the case should appear to His Majesty, with the advice of His Privy Council, to require it, from time to time during the present war, and for six months after the ratification of a definitive treaty of peace, the importation into, and the exportation from, any island in the West Indies (in which description the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somer Islands, are included), or any lands or territories on the Continent of South America to His Majesty belonging, of any such articles, goods, and commodities as should be mentioned in such Order of His Majesty in Council, in any ships or vessels belonging to the subjects of any State in amity with His Majesty, in such manner as His Majesty, His heirs, and successors, by and with the advice aforesaid; should direct, provided such ships or vessels should duly enter into, report, and deliver their respective cargoes, and reload at such ports only, where regular custom-houses should have been established:

And whereas it appears, at present, to be necessary to permit, for a limited time, subject to be sooner terminated, varied, or altered, as is hereinafter provided, the importation into, and exportation from the islands and territories of His Majesty in the West Indies, (including the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somer Islands,) and the lands and territories on the Continent of South America, to His Majesty belonging, of certain articles, goods, and commodities hereinafter mentioned, in any ships or vessels belonging to the subjects of any state in amity with His Ma-

jesty; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy-Council, to order, and doth hereby order, that the Governors and Lieutenant-Governors of His Majesty's islands and colonies in the West Indies, (in which description the Bahama Islands and the Bermuda or Somer Islands are included,) and of any lands or territories on the Continent of South America, to His Majesty belonging, and each and every such Governors and Lieutenant-Governors shall be authorised, and they, and each and every of them, are hereby authorised, to permit, for twelve months from the date hereof, subject to be sooner terminated, varied, or altered, as is hereinafter provided, in any ships or vessels belonging to the subjects of any state in amity with His Majesty, the importation into the said islands, colonies, lands and territories respectively, of corn, grain, meat, flour, bran, biscuit, pulse, rice, horses, mules, neat cattle, sheep, hogs, and every other species of live stock and live provisions; and also the exportation from the said islands, colonies, lands and territories respectively, into which such importation as aforesaid shall be made, of rum and molasses, and of any other articles, goods, and commodities whatsoever, except sugar, indigo, cotton, wool, coffee, and cocoa, provided always, that such articles so to be imported shall be of the growth or produce of the country to which the ship or vessel importing the same shall belong; provided also, that such ships or vessels shall duly enter into, report, and deliver their respective cargoes, and reload at such ports only where regular custom-houses shall have been established: But it is His Royal Highness's pleasure, nevertheless, and His Royal Highness, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice aforesaid, is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that nothing hereinbefore contained shall be construed to permit the importation of corn, grain, meal, flour, bran, biscuit, pulse, rice, horses, mules, neat cattle, sheep, hogs, or any other species of live stock and live provisions, into any of the said islands, lands or territories, in which there shall not be, at the time when such articles shall be brought for importation, the following duties on such articles, being of the growth or produce of the United States of America, namely:

And His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is further pleased to order, and doth hereby order, that, notwithstanding any thing hereinbefore contained, the said permission and authority to import and export, shall cease and determine, or be varied and altered, before the expiration of the abovementioned period of twelve months, at the expiration of six months after notification in the London Gazette of any Order of His Royal Highness, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, for revoking, varying, or altering such permission or authority, or shall cease and determine at the expiration of six months after the ratification of a definitive treaty of peace. *Chetwynd.*

At the Court at Carlton-House, the 30th of November 1813,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

HIS Royal Highness the Prince Regent having received information, that the Province of East Friesland, the State of Kniphausen, the

Dutchy of Oldenburgh, and the Dutchy of Bremen, are no longer under the dominion of France, is pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the blockade of that part of the coast of Germany, comprehended within the above description, (which was instituted by virtue of His Majesty's Orders in Council, of the 26th of April 1809, and of the 17th of May 1809, or of any other Orders in Council, Instruction, or Notification,) shall be discontinued, with the exception of such ports as may still be occupied by the troops of the enemy.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary measures herein as to them may respectively appertain.

HIS Serene Highness the Prince of Orange, accompanied by his Excellency the Earl of Clancarty, landed at Scheveling, from His Majesty's ship Warrior, Captain Lord Viscount Torrington, on Tuesday the 30th ultimo, at four o'clock in the afternoon, amidst the enthusiastic acclamations of a numerous concourse of people assembled to receive him.

His Serene Highness immediately proceeded to the Hague, and received the congratulations of the public Authorities at that place. His Serene Highness intended to proceed to Amsterdam on the 2d.

By the latest accounts received at the Hague, on the 2d instant, it was known that the enemy had evacuated Utrecht, and was retreating upon Gorcum and Nimeguen.

The Russian General Benkendorf had reached Amsterdam on the 1st, with 2500 men, and immediately issued the following Proclamation.

Muyden had been taken by assault, with a loss on the part of the enemy of four hundred men, twelve officers, and one gun.

His Majesty's ship Jason had anchored off Scheveling the morning of the 2d, with Major-General Taylor, and a part of the arms destined for the service of Holland.

Intelligence had been received on the same day, of the Brille having declared in favour of His Serene Highness the Prince of Orange.

Translation of a Proclamation of the Russian General de Benkendorff, at his entry into Amsterdam.

The Russian General de Benkendorff has just landed at Amsterdam, with two thousand five hundred in-

fantry: his regular cavalry and artillery will be to-morrow evening at Amersfoort: his regiments of cavalry, under the orders of General Staal, and Colonel Nariskin, are at Utrecht, and scour the country. Every Russian is animated with the noble desire of co-operating in the deliverance of Holland. They enter your country as friends. Hollanders, fly to arms—let one spirit animate you, that of becoming again a Nation, and of your being worthy of your ancestors. The hour is come;—the enemy will see what an united people can effect, when all dissensions are extinguished by the spirit of vengeance, and of the purest patriotism.

Translation of a Letter from General de Benkendorff to His Excellency the General Kragenoff, Commandant of the City of Amsterdam.

GENERAL, I have the honour to acquaint you,

I HAVE the honour to acquaint you, that a detachment of my troops has entered Muyden, has taken one gun, and that the whole garrison, composed of four hundred men and twelve officers, have fallen into our hands. The Hollanders have particularly distinguished themselves, fighting by the side of the Cossacks. At this moment a heavy firing is heard towards Naarden.

I hasten to communicate to you this important intelligence, and request you to publish it without delay at Amsterdam, and also to forward it to the Government at the Hague.

Munich, near Frankfurt,

My Lord,

November 18, 1813.

IN a former dispatch I stated to your Lordship, the substance of a report, received on the morning of the 15th, from General Thielman, of the surrender of Dresden and its garrison as prisoners of war. By the more official advices which your Lordship will now receive, you will learn the report received at the head-quarters of the Army of the North was not correct, as to the surrender of the garrison as prisoners of war. A capitulation was demanded and acceded to, by which the garrison was to return to France, and be exchanged man for man. This has not been raised by the Commander-in-Chief, so there must be still some short delay before this important place is in our possession.

I sincerely regret having given your Lordship a report which came to me on such good authority, which, nevertheless, has turned out not to be confirmed in all its facts.

DISPATCHES from Captain Farquhar, commanding His Majesty's naval forces in the Elbe and Weser, addressed to Mr. Croker, announce that on the 23d ultimo, the French garrison of Carlsburg, (Bremerlehe) consisting of two hundred and thirty-six officers and men, with thirteen pieces of heavy ordnance, surrendered themselves prisoners of war to the combined British and Russian forces; the latter commanded by Colonel de Radinger, and that on the 24th ult. the garrison of Blexen also surrendered prisoners of war to the same forces. The officers of this garrison are to be sent to France on parole, not to serve against the allies for one year.

Captain Farquhar reports, that the banks of the river Weser are now perfectly clear of the enemy.

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
