Whitehall, November 27, 1813.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that John Farrow, of the borough of Macclesfield, whitesmith, was on the morning of Friday the 29th day of October last, found dead at the bottom of the stairs of his own dwelling-house, having a deep wound on the left side of his head, and that there are very strong suspicions that the said John Farrow was murdered;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the said murder, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually committed the same), who shall discover his or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
