AT the Court at *Carlton-House*, the 30th of November 1813,

PRESENT,

His Royal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, made and passed in the forty-sixth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for authorising His Majesty, in Council, to allow during the present war, and for six months after the ratification of a definitive treaty of peace, the importation and exportation of certain goods and commodities, in neutral ships, into and from His Majesty's territories in the West Indies and Continent of South America," it was enacted, that, from and after the passing of the said Act, it should and might be lawful for His Majesty, His heirs, and successors, by and with the advice of His and their Privy Council, to permit, or to authorise the Governors of the said islands and territories, in such manner and under such restrictions as to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, should seem fit, to permit, when the necessity of the case should appear to His Majesty, with the advice of His Privy Council, to require it, from time to time during the present war, and for six months after the ratification of a definitive treaty of peace, the importation into, and the exportation from, any island in the West Indies (in which description the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somer Islands, are included), or any lands or territories on the Continent of South America to His Majesty belonging, of any such articles, goods, and commodities as should be mentioned in such Order of His Majesty in Council, in any ships or vessels belonging to the subjects of any State in amity with His Majesty, in such manner as His Majesty, His heirs, and successors, by and with the advice aforesaid; should direct, provided such ships or vessels should duly enter into, report, and deliver their respective cargoes, and reload at such ports only, where regular custom-houses should have been established;

And whereas it appears, at present, to be neces-

sary to permit, for a limited time, subject to be sooner terminated, varied, or altered, as is hereinafter provided, the importation into, and exportation from the islands and territories of His Majesty in the West Indies, (including the Bahama Islands, and the Bermuda or Somer Islands,) and the lands and territories on the Continent of South America, to His Majesty belonging, of certain articles, goods, and commodities hereinafter mentioned, in any ships or vessels belonging to the subjects of any state in amity with His Majesty; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and doth hereby order, that the Governors and Lieutenant-Governors of His Majesty's islands and colonies in the West Indies, (in which description the Bahama Islands and the Bermuda or Somer Islands are included,) and of any lands or territories on the Continent of South America, to His Majesty belonging, and each and every such Governors and Lieutenant-Governors shall be authorised, and they, and each and every of them, are hereby authorised to permit, for twelve months from the date hereof, subject to be sooner terminated, varied, or altered, as is hereinafter provided, in any ships or vessels belonging so the subjects of any state in amity with His Majesty, the importation into the said islands, colonies, lands and territories respectively, of corn, grain, meal, flour, bran, biscuit, pulse, rice, horses, mules, neat-cattle, sheep, hogs, and every other species of live stock and live provisions; and also the exportation from the said islands, colonies, lands and territories respectively, into which such importation as aforesaid shall be made, of rum and molasses, and of any other articles, goods, and commodities whatsoever, except sugar, indigo, cotton wool, coffee, and cocoa; provided always, that such articles so to be imported shall be of the growth or produce of the country to which the ship or vessel importing the same shall belong; provided also, that such ships or vessels shall duly enter into, report, and deliver their respective cargoes, and reload at such ports only where regular custom-houses shall have been established: But it is His

Royal Highness's pleasure, nevertheless, and His Majesty, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice aforesaid, is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that nothing hereinbefore contained shall be construed to permit the importation of corn, grain, meal, flour, bran, biscuit, pulse, rice, horses, mules, neat cattle, sheep, hogs, or any other species of live stock and live provisions, into any of the said islands, lands or territories, in which there shall not be, at the time when such articles shall be brought for importation, the following duties on such articles, being of the growth or produce of the United States of America, namely:

And His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is further pleased to order, and doth hereby order, that, notwithstanding any thing hereinbefore contained, the said permission and authority to import and export, shall cease and determine, or be varied and altered, before the expiration of the above mentioned period of twelve months, at the expiration of six months after notification in the London Gazette of any Order of His Royal Highness, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, for revoking, varying, or altering such permission or authority, or shall cease and determine at the expiration of six months after the ratification of a definitive treaty of peace. *Chetwynd.*

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent having received information, that the Province of East Frizeland, the State of Kniphausen, the

Dutchy of Oldenburgh, and the Dutchy of Bremen, are no longer under the dominion of France, is pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the blockade of that part of the coast of Germany, comprehended within the above description, (which was instituted by virtue of His Majesty's Orders in Council, of the 26th of April 1809, and of the 17th of May 1809, or of any other Orders in Council, Instruction, or Notification,) shall be discontinued, with the exception of such ports as may still be occupied by the troops of the enemy.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and the Judge of the High Court of Admiralty, and the Judges of the Courts of Vice-Admiralty, are to take the necessary measures herein as to them may respectively appertain. *Chetwynd.*

WHEREAS the time limited by the Order of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent in Council, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and twelve, for the payment of the bounties, for the encouragement of seamen and landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and the rewards for discovering seamen who may conceal themselves, so that such seamen should be taken for His Majesty's service, and also the rewards to persons who should procure the voluntary service of able and ordinary seamen and landmen, fit for His Majesty's Naval Service, and should convey such seamen and landmen on board any of His Majesty's ships and vessels, or to any of His Majesty's sea officers employed in raising men, will expire on the thirty-first day of December next, which bounties and rewards are as follows; that is to say; To every able seaman, not above the age of fifty, nor under the age of twenty years, who should enter himself to serve in His Majesty's Royal Navy, a bounty of five pounds; and to every ordinary seaman so entering himself, and not above the age of fifty, nor under the age of twenty years, a bounty of two pounds ten shillings; to every able-bodied landman, not above the age of thirty-five, nor under the age of eighteen years, so entering himself, a bounty of thirty shillings; to every person or persons who shall discover any able or ordinary seaman or seamen who may have concealed him or themselves, so that such seaman or seamen shall be taken for His Majesty's service by any of His Majesty's officers employed to raise men, a reward of three pounds for every such able seaman, and fifty shillings for every such ordinary seaman fit to serve on board His Majesty's ships;

to any person or persons who shall procure the voluntary service of able or ordinary seamen or landmen fit for His Majesty's service, and shall convey them on board any of His Majesty's ships or vessels, or to any of His Majesty's sea officers employed in raising men, a reward of three guineas for every such able seaman, and two guineas for every such ordinary seaman, and one guinea for every such landman, together with an allowance at the rate of one penny per mile, for each able seaman, ordinary seaman, and landman, for every mile such man may respectively travel to the nearest of His Majesty's ships of war, or nearest place of residence of any of His Majesty's sea officers employed in raising men, provided such man shall be found fit for His Majesty's service, and there shall not be reason to suppose he is an apprentice: And whereas it is expedient, that the said several bounties, rewards, and travelling allowance, should be continued to be paid for some time longer; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, doth therefore order, and it is hereby accordingly ordered, that the payment of the said bounties, rewards, and travelling allowance, be continued to the thirty-first day of December one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, inclusive; and that the same be paid in the manner specified in His Majesty's several proclamations now in force for the encouragement of seamen and landmen to enter into His Majesty's Royal Navy, and for the discovering seamen who may conceal themselves, and for giving rewards for procuring the voluntary service of seamen and landmen; whereof all persons concerned are to take notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Deputy Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by the Prince Regent, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, for declaring His Majesty's Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for giving effect to certain engagements of His Majesty with the Emperor of All the Rus-

sias and the King of Prussia, for furnishing a part of the pecuniary succours for assisting His Majesty's said Allies in supporting the expences of the war with France.

An Act to provide for the charge of the addition to the public funded debt of Great Britain, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and fourteen.

An Act to continue, until the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, and amend an Act for regulating the drawbacks and bounties on the exportation of sugar from Ireland.

An Act for fixing the commencement and termination of licences to be granted for the distillation of spirits from corn or grain in Scotland.

An Act to enable His Majesty to accept the services of a proportion of the militia of the City of London, out of the United Kingdom, for the vigorous prosecution of the war.

An Act to amend an Act, passed in the fifty-first year of the Reign of His Majesty, intituled An Act to permit the interchange of the British and Irish militias respectively.

An Act for extending the provisions of an Act, passed in the forty-sixth year of His present Majesty, (for making better provision for soldiers,) to serjeants of the militia.

An Act to enable His Majesty to augment the sixtieth regiment to ten battalions, by admitting of foreigners.

An Act to indemnify such persons in the United Kingdom as have omitted to qualify themselves for offices and employments, and for extending the times limited for those purposes respectively, until the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and fifteen, and to permit such persons in Great Britain, as have omitted to make oaths and affidavits of the execution of indentures of clerks to attornies and solicitors, to make and file the same, on or before the first day of May one thousand eight hundred and fifteen.

An Act to explain an Act of the forty-fifth year of His present Majesty, for declaring what persons shall be disabled from sitting and voting in the House of Commons of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland.

An Act to stay, until the twentieth day of April one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, proceedings in actions under an Act passed in the forty-third year of His Majesty to amend the laws relating to spiritual persons.

An Act to provide, that property vested in the Accountant-General of the High Court of Chancery, as such, shall upon his death, removal, or resignation, vest from time to time in those who shall succeed to the office.

An Act for the more easy recovery of debts in His Majesty colony of New South Wales.

An Act to continue and amend two Acts of the thirty-eighth and forty-third years of His present Majesty, for more effectually repairing that part of the roads from Manchester to Rochdale, Bury, and Radcliffe-Bridge, all in the County-Palatine of Lancaster, which is called the Manchester District; and for making and maintaining a new branch of road to communicate therewith.

Proclamation of His Serene Highness the Prince of Orange, on his arrival at the Hague.

William Frederic, by the Gract of God, Prince of Orange and Nassau, &c. &c. &c. To all those who these presents shall see, or hear read, greeting: be it made known,

Dear Countrymen!

AFTER nineteen years of absence and suffering, I have received with heartfelt joy your unanimous invitation to come amongst you. I am now arrived, and I trust, under Divine Providence, that I shall be the means of restoring you to your ancient independence and prosperity. This is my sole object, and I have the satisfaction to assure you, that it is equally the object of the allied powers. It is in particular the wish of the Prince Regent of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of His Government. Of this you will be convinced, by the magnanimous assistance which that powerful country is immediately going to give you, and which, I trust, will lay the foundation of the renewal of those old and intimate ties of friendship and alliance which used to begeth the happiness of both states.—I am come disposed and determined to forgive and forget every thing that has passed. We have all the same common object, which is to heal the wounds of our native country, and to restore it to its rank and splendor amongst nations. The revival of its trade and commerce will, I trust, be the immediate consequence of my return. All party spirit must be for ever banished from amongst us. No effort shall be wanting on my part, and on that of my family to assert and secure your independence and to promote your happiness and welfare. My eldest Son, who, under the immortal Lord Wellington, has proved himself not unworthy of the fame of his ancestors, is on his way to join me. Unite therefore, dear countrymen, with heart and soul, with me, and our common country will flourish again as in the days of old, and we shall transmit, unimpaired, to our posterity the blessings we have received from our ancestors.

Copy of a Letter from Captain Farquhar, of His Majesty's Ship *Desirée*, to John Wilson Croker, Esq. dated off Cuxhaven, the 2d instant.

SIR,

IHAVE the honour to enclose, for the information of my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, a duplicate of a letter I have written to Admiral Young, giving a detail of the capitulation and surrender of the French batteries at Cuxhaven.

His Majesty's Ship Desirée, off Cuxhaven,

SIR,

December 1, 1813.

IHAVE the honour to acquaint you, that the French batteries of Phare and Napoleon, have yesterday entered into capitulation, and this morning surrendered to a detachment of His Imperial Majesty's Russian troops, commanded by Colonel Alexander Radinger, and His Britannic Majesty's squadron (as per margin*), under my command.

On the 28th ultimo, I arrived here (from Bremerlehe), where I found Captain Green, of the *Shamrock*, had collected the squadron, to co-operate with the Russian troops. On the same evening, I ordered the gun-boats to take a position above Napoleon, and to cannonade that battery, in concert with the Russian troops, and advanced the squadron ready to attack Phare (or Cuxhaven).

On the 29th, a brisk and well directed fire was kept upon Fort Napoleon by the gun-boats, and from field-pieces from the Russian line, with considerable effect; and their tirailleurs annoyed the enemy in both batteries, by a constant fire of musketry, which was returned with vigour, and from the battery of Phare, red-hot shot were fired, which burnt several houses in the town. During this time, we were employed in landing guns from the squadron, and erecting a battery within four hundred yards of the works of Phare. On the morning of the 30th, it was completed, and presented to the enemy a formidable appearance, consisting of ten guns, viz. six eighteen-pounders, two thirty-two-pounders, and two six-pounders. The morning was quite thick and obscured our works, but as soon as it cleared, and we were ready to commence our attack, the enemy threw out a truce, which has ended in the surrender of these two extremely strong batteries, consisting of twenty-six heavy guns, two thirteen-inch mortars, and a blockhouse with a garrison of three hundred men and officers, who have been made prisoners of war.

The expedition with which Captains Green and Banks, (who had the direction of forming and completing the seamen's battery,) performed that service, I trust will speak for itself. Lieutenant

Kaultain, whom I had occasion to mention on a recent occasion, as a volunteer, continued his services, and with all the officers and men of the squadron, employed on this occasion, merit my best thanks, as well as the gun-boats (under the direction of Lieutenant Haumer), who particularly distinguished themselves, by their well-directed fire, and by the injury they did to the enemy's works.

I have very great pleasure in stating to you, Sir, that in the last ten days the small detachment of Russian troops, commanded by Colonel Radinger, assisted by His Majesty's squadron under my command, have been fortunate in reducing four strong batteries, consisting of fifty heavy guns, four mortars, and eight hundred men and officers, all prisoners of war; and I cannot help expressing the satisfaction which I feel in acquainting you, that the whole of this service has been carried on with the greatest cordiality between the co-operating forces, both officers and men; not the smallest misunderstanding on any occasion.

I am extremely happy to state, that the loss on this occasion has been very trifling; on the part of the Russians two killed and three wounded; we have sustained no loss. I have thought it right to forward this dispatch, without delay, by Sir George Keith, in the Redbreast, who takes to England the officers of Fort Phare, who are prisoners of war.

Two days ago I had the pleasure to learn, that Stadt had been taken possession of by a Russian detachment, under the orders of Count Strogonoff.
