Whitehall, December 18, 1813.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented unto His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that on the morning of Wednesday the 8th instant, about four o'clock, some persons having got into the premises adjoining the house of Misses Comperitz, at Vauxhall, in the parish of Lambeth, effected the taking down of the outside shutter of the kitchen window, and, after taking out a pane of glass, attempted an entrance into the house: the footman, named Moses Merry, who slept in an adjoining room, hearing the noise, repaired to the window, when one of the persons immediately fired at, and killed the said Moses Merry;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned therein, is hereby pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious pardon to any one of the offenders (except the person who actually committed the said murder), who shall discover his or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of ONE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered by the parish of St. Mary, Lambeth, and ONE HUNDRED POUNDS by the inhabitants of the neighbourhood where the murder was committed, to any person making such discovery as aforesaid (except as is before excepted), to be paid on the conviction of any one or more of the offenders. The latter reward to be paid by Mr. Samuel Hale, of the Retreat, Vauxhall.
