Rid Colonel Kirky, having fix Mert of the tallef! Stature, with long. Fulls, on each fiele of his Horfe. In which order having pro-sended 2 and dilayes beyond Europe Earl Mair Body creded a good diffence beyond Foundain-Fur, the Main Body of the Moors (which were about 200 Horle with their Launof the Moors (which were about 200 Horle with their Laun-des) being now within Musker Shot of ns, made an Hals, and the Ambaliador, with about thirty Perform in his Company, advanced towards Colonel Kire, whom be reditted with thole field Coremonies being over, Colonel Kirle went to make his Salutations to the Alcaid or genauturata, Vice-Roy of thele Contregs, who remained in the head of the o her Moorifh Partie; which being erd d, the Alcaid and the Am-baliador, with each of their Parties, began a Skirmilh, it being their mancer of rejoicing and expreding their faits-facuon; where having fhown their Horimanhip and Skill in managing their Launces and Fufis, they at length of systed. Tachood, where name now internormaning and skin in managing their Launces and Fufils, they ar length parted, -the Atcaid going off-with his Men, and the Amballador with his Train proceeding, in Colonel Krit's Company, towards the Town. In their way, pating by Bridg s-tort (at a fign made) he was saluted from Vol - tort with ten Chambers,one Great Guny and a Volley of Small fhot: By the timethat was ended, he was arrived at the Spir of Kalbernha-Gire,and then the Guns began re Fire from P submyth-Tower, asand then the Guns began to Fire from P suboring M-Tower, as far as Devils-Tower. Immediately en his entrance into the Gate, Mr. Mayor, with the whole Corporation in all their for-Gate, Mr. Mayor, with the whole Corporation in all their for-finalities, met him, Mr. Recorder welcoming him with a Speech: From thence they proceeded towards the Water-gate, the streets being lined on both fides with the Muskerette of the Scotch Regiment, all the Officers Salutiag the Ambaffador as the paffed. At *Hides-Battery* he was Saluted by the Officers of the fecond Batalion of Colonel Kirk's Regiment, which was drawn up there, and by all the Guns from that Battery and the Mole In the little Parrade the Ambaffador Rode through a Lane of the Town Militia, who appeared very well in Arns'; and thence into the Off Parrade; through the Governours whole Regiment drawn ap in two Batalions the Governours whole Regiment drawn ap in two Batallions. The States of Flanders have con-fented to the Sublidies defined by his Highness the Princoof Parma; and his Highnels has refored to the Magilirates of Gaunt, feveral Priviledges which th y have been deprived of, every fince they were in the hauds of the French, fuck as the keeping of the Keys of the City, and having the Gates Guarded by the Burghers, So. A Quarrel having happened b.tween the Duke of Norfolk and the Senf-Ichal of Haynant, Brother to the Prince of Ligne, and a Challenge pailing thereupon between them, they are gone, as is aid, notwithit and ing all the endeavours that were u ed here to prevent it, to fight in the Countrey of Liege. The lecond Inflant arrived here an Officer of the Garrifon of Luxemb rg, fant by the Prince of Chimay, to acquaint his High-nels that the Count de Valjafine was arrived their with the Moneys under his charge, and that thereupon a Months Pay had been given the Soldiers, which had very much encouraged them. That on the 28th pall, some Countrey people had had the good fortune to get 200 Cows, Sheep, and Hoge mto the Town; and that the French, upon the notice they had of it, had doubled their Guards, and to bef t all the Paflages, that it was now almost impossible to get into the Place without their leave. The French, as we are told, have formed a pretention upon the Town and Abby of Oudenburg, between Bruges and Newport.
