THIS day His Excellency Count Mervellit, General of Cavalry, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from His Majesty the Emperor of Austria, had a private audience of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, to deliver his credentials; also Baron de Wassenberg, Envoy Extraordinary from His Imperial Majesty, had his audience of leave of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent:

To which they were respectively introduced by the Earl of Liverpool, and conducted by Robert Chester, Esq. Assistant Master of the Ceremonies.

*Whitehall, March 7, 1814.*

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent hath been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Jonathan Wathen Phipps, of Braywick-Lodge, in the county of Berks, and of Twickenham, in the county of Middlesex, Esq. His Majesty's royal licence and authority, that he and his issue may, from affectionate regard to the memory of his maternal great uncle James Waller, Esq. take and use the surname, and bear the arms of Waller only; such arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise His Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect;

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.
