His Royal Highness the Prings Regent, by virtue of the powers vested in His Majesty by sandry Acts of Parliament, set forth in the said Order in Council of the 7th of this instant March, is thereupon pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for the space of six mouths from and after the 25th day of this instant March; the importation of rice from any of the possessions of the East India Company, or from any British colony or plantation, in British ships or vessels, without payment of any duty whatsoever; any thing contained in the Order in Council above-mentioned of the 7th day of this instant March, to the contrary notwithstanding. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly. .... Chetwind.
