HEREAS by virtue of the powers vested in His Majesty by sundry Acts of Parliament, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 7th of this instant March, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to allow, and did thereby allow, for the space of six months, to commence from the 25th day of this instant March, the importation from any port or place whatsoever, into any port or place of Great Britain, of certain articles of provision therein named, subject to the rules and regulations set forth in the said Order, without payment of any duty whatsoever, except inrespect to the article of rice, which when imported should be subject to such duties as might by law be payable hereon; and whereas it is expedient that rice imported in British ships or vessels, directly from any of the possessions of the East India Company, or from any British colony or plantation, should be exempted from the payment of the said duties, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, by virtue of the powers vested in His Majesty by sundry Acts of Parliament, set forth in the said Order in Council of the 7th of this instant March, is thereupon pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for the space of six months from and after the 25th day of this instant March; the importation of rice from any of the possessions of the East India Company, or from any British colony or plantation, in British ships or vessels, without payment of any duty whatsoever; any thing contained in the Order in Council above-mentioned of the 7th day of this instant March, to the contrary notwithstanding. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

His Hoyal Highness the PRINCE REGENT in Council.

HEREAS, by virtue of the powers vested in His Majesty, by sundry Acts of Parliament, His Royal Highness the Prince Regent was pleased, by His Order in Council of the twentieth of February one thousand eight hundred and thirteen, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to allow, and did thereby allow, until the twentyfifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, the importation into any port or place of Great Britain, of certain articles of provisions, in the manner and under the conditions therein mentioned; and whereas by an Act passed in the fifty-first year of His present Majesty, cap. 14, it is enacted, that an Act made in the thirty-ninth year of His present Majesty, intituled " An Act for enabling His Majesty to prohibit "the exportation, and permit the importation of corn, and for allowing the importation of " other articles of provision without payment of "duty, to continue in force until six weeks after " the commencement of the next session of Par-" liament," which was continued by an Act of the thirty-ninth and fortieth years of His present Majesty, and amended and further continued by several subsequent Acts until the twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eleven, shall, from and after the said twenty-fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eleven, be, and the same is thereby further continued during the continuance of the war, and until six months after the ratification of a definitive treaty of peace; His Royal Highness the Prince Regent is thereupon pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to allow, and doth hereby allow, for the space of six months, to commence from the twenty-fifth day of this Chetwynd. | instant March, the importation from any port or

Copy of a Letter from Captain Sir Michael Seymour, of His Majesty's Ship Hannibal, addressed to Admiral Sir Richard Bickerton, Bart. and transmitted by the Admiral to John Wilson Croker, Esq.

His Majesty's Ship Hannibal, at Sea, March 27, 1814. SIR,

HAVE the pleasure to acquaint you of the capture of La Sultane, French frigate, of fortyfour guns and three hundred and thirty men, at a quarter past three P. M. yesterday, after an ineffeetual endeavour to disable this ship.

When spread on the look-out from the Hebrus at ten A. M. Isle de Bas S. E. twelve leagues, with a light breeze from the S. W. it came very thick weather, and gans were heard in the N. N. E. and on its clearing up, proceeding under all sail, I found the Hebrus near me, the Sparrow in the N.W. and two enemy's frigates E. by N. five or six miles distant, one with jury topmasts and sails, and the other with double recred topsails, apparently having suffered from tempest or action. We neared them fast, but on the wind's changing at eleven to the N. N. W. very fresh, one hauled S. E. and the other E. by N. and I directed the Hebrus, as the best sailing ship, and the Sparrow to pursue the seemingly most perfect frigate; and I lost sight of them, going above ten knots at two P. M. when the Hebrus was closing the enemy very fast, and afterwards about three, four gnns were heard.

The other ship is L'Etoile, which with La Sul-

tane, lost each twenty killed and about thirty wounded, in action with the Creole and Astrea, off Isle of Mayo, two months since, and each had three hundred and fifty men on sailing from the Loire.
