Tlat the Chapars which are in pollefion of confer riag Prebe:ds and other Dignities thall continue to ditj ofe cf th: $m$ duing the vacapsy of the Sees, Thut in the churches where the Collation is alcernstive betwe: $n$ the Bifhops and the chapters, the fakse lhall be obferved during the vacancy of the See (ruer the King has the right of Regality) in like manner as whin the See is full, the Kiag having the Turn which the B. fhop fould have had. That in the Places where the Bilhops difpore of the Prebends joyntly with the Chapter, the King fhall in the vacancy of the See, appoint a Commiflioner, who thall liave the fame Place and Power in the Chapter, which the Bifhophad; fo that the King fhall enjoy, during the vacancy of the Churchesin this Kingdom, the fame Rights which the Bifhops rave, with regard to their Chapteis. And thefe Propofitions having been Tr fented to tis Majefty by the ArchbiGhop of Paris; the Kirg appointed Commifioners to examine them, and upon' their report, has by a . Eeclaration, which was publifhed on Saturday faft, approved the foid Propefitious, and Com--manded the punclul 1 execuition of them. And now we are expecting to hear how far the Court of pome will be plealed with them.

Paris, Fan. 24. Ycu have herec, fore been told that the Pope, being very mugh offended with Father Maintourg, for a Book he write, had by feveral Briefs tequired the Jefuits to expell -him th ir Society, but that the King had forbid them to ob y theere iricfs, and had taken the faid Father into his ProteCtion; fince, the Matter has bein fo orciered, that the faid Fathr Mainbourg has 1 ft that Society (whin be did on Friday laft) and has put himelf into another Order; it's tot doubtci but this is done to give the Pope fatisfaction, whether it will or not, and what confequence it will have, time muft inform us. There is a redort as if the King defigned very fuddainly to take ja journey, but whither, or the occafion of it, is not faid. We are told that the Sieur Catimat, Governor of Cazal preffes the Inhabitants of MowtFerrat to fwear Allegiance to the King.
