ment, in consequeuce of the extreme difficulty experienced, and the enormous expence incurred in supplying the troops alloted for their defence with provisions, aud the daily decrease of their arny by sickness and desertion, arising from the harassing an:l fatiguing duties to which their troops were exposed, from the constant apprchension of being attacked by us;
As soon as information of the eneny's movement was reccived Colonịl Scott, of the 103 d regiment, with a suall effective force, consisting of detachments from that corps, the 89th, and Canadian Feucibles, and a picker of light cavalry from Cotean da Lete and Coriitwall, passed over the Ice from the latter post to the Salmon River, and arrived in time to press upou the enemy's rear-guard, which made a precipitate retreat; and about a bundred sleight loads of provisions and stores"bave fallen into our possession, and the destruction of their block-houses; harracks; and boats, bas been completet:
Colouel Scott adranced, with His party without opposition into tha cueny's comatry to Malone, Madrid, and withia a few miles of Platsburg, and returned by the route of Foui Comers, to his post at the Coteau du Lac.
