A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, P. R.

WHEREAS a Definitive Treaty of Peace and Friendship between His Majesty and His Most Christian Majesty hath been concluded at Paris on the thirtieth day of May last; in conformity thereunto, We have thought fit, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, hereby to command, that the same be published throughout all His Majesty's dominions; and We do declare to all His Majesty's loving subjects Our will and pleasure, that the said Treaty of Peace and Friendship be observed inviolably, as well by sea as land, and in all places whatsoever; strictly charging and commanding all His Majesty's loving subjects to take notice hereof, and to conform themselves thereunto accordingly.

Given at the Court at Carlton-House, the seventeenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and fourteen, and in the fifty-fourth year of His Majesty's reign.

For a Public Thanksgiving.

WHEREAS it has pleased Almighty God, in His great goodness, to put an end to the long, extended, and bloody warfare in which We were engaged against France and her Allies; We, therefore, adoring the Divine goodness, and duly considering, that the great and public blessings of

peace do call for public and solemn acknowledgments, have thought fit, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to issue this Proclamation, hereby appointing and commanding, that a General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for these His mercies, be observed throughout those parts of the United Kingdom called England and Ireland, on Thursday the seventh day of July next; and for the better and more devout solemnization of the same, We have given directions to the Most Reverend the Archbishops, and the Right Reverend the Bishops of England, to compose a Form of Prayer, suitable to this occasion, to be used in all churches and chapels, and other places of public worship, and to take care for the timely dispersing of the same throughout their respective dioceses; and We do strictly charge and command, that the said public Day of Thanksgiving be religiously observed by all His Majesty's loving subjects, as they tender the favour of Almighty God, and upon pain of suffering such punishment as may be justly inflicted upon all such as shall contemn or neglect the same.
