His Royal Highness the Prince Regent hath been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Thomas Sydenham, Esq. His Majesty's royal licence and permission, that he may accept and wear the insignia of the Imperial Russian Military Order of St. George of the fourth class, and of a Knight of the Royal Swedish Military Order of the Sword, which their Imperial and Royal Majesties the Emperor of Russia and the King of Sweden have been respectively pleased to confer upon the said Thomas Sydenham, in testimony of the high sense entertained by those Sovereigns of the distinguished services rendered by him to the common cause, in the presence of the enemy, while serving in the field in the combined army under the command of His Royal Highness the Prince Royal of Sweden, and the bravery displayed by him on the field of battle during the last campaign; provided nevertheless, that His Majesty's said licence and permission doth not authorise, and shall not be deemed or construed to authorise, the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms.

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered, together with the relative documents, in His Majesty's College of Arms.

His Royal Highness the Prince Regent has been pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, to give and grant unto Charles Felix Smith, Esq. Lieutenant-Colonel in the Army, and Captain in the Corps of Royal Engineers, His Majesty's royal licence and authority, that he may accept and wear the Supernumerary Cross of the Royal and distinguished Order of Charles the Third of Spain, which His Catholic Majesty hath been pleased to confer upon him in consideration of the military services rendered by that Officer in the Peninsula, but more particularly for his skill and highly distinguished merit in the defence of Tarifa, in December 1811; provided nevertheless, that His Majesty's said licence and permission doth not authorise, and shall not be deemed or construed to authorise, the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining unto a Knight Bachelor of these realms.

And His Royal Highness hath been further pleased to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered, together with the relative documents, in His Majesty's College of Arms.
