#### Madrid, Jan. 22.

He Count de Vauguyon, Ambalfador Extraordinary from the Crown of France, is arrived here, and is preparing for his publick Entry. The King has fent the Sieur Carillo with a Commillion to Command his Forces in Bifcay, upon fome Advices his Majefly had received, that the French were drawing their Forces together on thefe Frontiers, and that it was fulfpected they defigned to attempt fomething by way of fatisfaction, for the Murth r of the Filhermen of Andaye, which they pretend was committed by the Inhabitants of Fonterabia.

Vienna, Feb. 1. The ill weather has for fome days hindred the departure of Count Caprara, the Emperors Ambaffador to the Grand Signior, who it's nowfaid, will begin his Journey the beginning of the next werek without fail. "The Conferences that were appointed to be held at Tirhaw, are removed to Callovia, wh rethe Palatine of Hungary, and feveral of the greateft Men of that Kingdom, are now repairing to Treat with Count Teckeley. the Chief of the Hungarian Malecontents, who for that purpole will come thither in perfon. The Duke of Lorrain will flay fome time here, and we are affured that if the Emperor have an Armyin the Field this next Summer, his Highnefs will Command it. Monficur Schube is come hither, and it is faid that the Emperor will give him the Count of all his Dragoons, which are to be reinforced-with 3000 Men in three Regiments : we are told that there will be likewile raifed nine new Regiments of Foot, and three of Croats, befides four of Horfe.

The States of the Circle of Bavaria Affen bled at Wallerburg, have reloved to lu nilh their Quota of the Army of the Empire in two Months, reckoning from the 22 of Farmery, and even looner, if the necessity of Affairs thall fo require ; and have withal Declared, that if it shall be thought necessary to add 20000 Men more to the faid Army, that they will with great reading fscontribute their part thereof. The like Reformions we doubt not will be taken by the other Circles; and that they will be diligently and effectually exesuted, in order to the brigging the faid Army into the Field, to act as there may be occasion for the defence and fecurity of the Empire. In the mean time little is to be expected from the Conferences appointed to be held here; and fince the Declara ion which the French Amballadors made, of the king their Malters pretention, to have all the Lands and Places he has poffelfed himfelf of fince the Peace of Nimeguen, yielded to him, the hopes many had of this Meeting are quite vanished.

Cologne, Feb. 20. Our Elector is going to raife 1400 Meu. and Colonel d' Av la has a Committion, to raife a Regiment for the S rvice of the Empeor

Bruffe s, Fel. 17. Yellerday arrived here an Extraordinary Courier from Spain, who, amorg others, brought Orders for the Count d' Archinio s continuing here in the flation he now isin. An Exprefs is likewile arrived from Luxemburg, with an account that that place is every day more and more fireightened, and that the French are going to make a Cittedel of the Capucins Cloyiter at Arlon. Colonel Obern is arrived at Oftend with the Recruits for the Irilh Regiment; and two other Ships are daily expected with the reft. Colonel Porter's Re-giment is Muffered and Clothed, and has Orders to march to Malines. The Senefchal of Liege, who was apprehended near Nemport, is brought Prilor-er to the Callle of Gaunt. The Letters from Liege inform us, that the French have hitherto forbore to execute the Decree of the Savereign Chamber of Metz, adjudging the Countrey of Stavelo as a Dependance to the Crown of France; and that their Troops which were marching thither to take poffellion of the fame, have been countermanded, up on the applications that have been made to his most Christian Majesty by the Bishop of Strasburg.

Bruffels, Feb. 20. The Prince of Parma having received Orders from Spain to relieve the City of Luxemburg, has thereupon held a Great Council of War, to confult with the General Officers about the putting them in execution; they have all according to his Highneffes defire, delivered their opinions in Writing. And at the fame time we are informed, that his Highnefs is fending General Agurto for Holland (and that he will part hence to morrow Morning) to Demand of the States-General the affiliance flipulated by the Treaty between the Crown of Spain and them. Last night Monfieur del Valarrived here from Paris, and had this day a long Audience of h's Highness; and we are told, that he will return for France the next weel. Count Valfalyn, who arrived here fome time fince from Luxemburg, is dispatched back with Moneys for that Garrison. Monsieur Heugh, late Ambalfador from the Kipg of Denmark at the French. Court, arrived here last Juckiay, and parted again yelterday"Morning,

Bruffels, Feb. 24. We have Advice from Luxemburg, that the Gunners and Ingeniers, whom his Highnels fent thither about ten days fince, are fairly entred the Place, notwithitanding all the precautions the French had uled to hinder. it; and we hope that by this time Count Vallafine, who carried with himr2,000 Crowns, is likewi e arrived there.
